I decided to go through Mary's "Dean Speak" articles to get some perspective on the changes that have occurred in the College since 2009. There were 555 undergraduate students enrolled in 2008, just prior to Mary beginning as dean. The numbers rose to 1100 in 2015, 1250 in 2016, with similar numbers in 2019. Total student numbers (including graduate students) reached 1572 in 2019, a 70% increase since 2009! Other accomplishments included upgrading of the Phytotron, the opening of the Rayner Dairy Teaching and Research Facility, the Canada Feed Research Facility, and the LFCE, to name a few. Additionally, programming for First Nations was also initiated. Mary was a tireless promoter of the college, the faculty, and Agro students.
