5. Correspondence – R. Bellamy

m) Crop Production Week - K. Head

The 2011 Crop Production Week, by all accounts, was rated as successful. The Special Session on Wednesday evening was very well received. Crop Production Show (Prairie Land Park) also proved to be successful with the largest attendance on record - 17,000+. The Crop Production Show 2012 will run from Jan. 9th to Jan. 12th.
