Twenty years ago, Saskatchewan Agricultural Graduates' Association (SAGA) published "Historical Review and Register of Graduates" for the 45 year period 1935 to 1980. The organization decided that an updated history be published as a millennium project in the year 2000.

Much had happened in the last 20 years that is of interest to agricultural grads and an effort has been made to include those happenings in this book. Graduating classes, especially in the degree program, have been large, so our alumni has grown substantially and with many more women graduates than in earlier years. The names and home communities of those graduates are recorded in these pages.

Listed also are those who won awards as students and graduates who provided leadership to SAGA.

The buildings used in teaching and research have multiplied to serve the growing number of students and expanded academic offerings. These and the land holdings are described.

Saskatchewan ag grads played a vital role in getting a new Agriculture Building and have been at the fore in other projects of value to the college and its student body.

And of course SAGA continues to serve the social needs of its members through its newsletter, *THE SAGA*, and help with annual reunions.

This chapter identifies some of the more significant happenings in the 65-year history of SAGA. Chapter 3 "Blow by Blow" provides added detail.

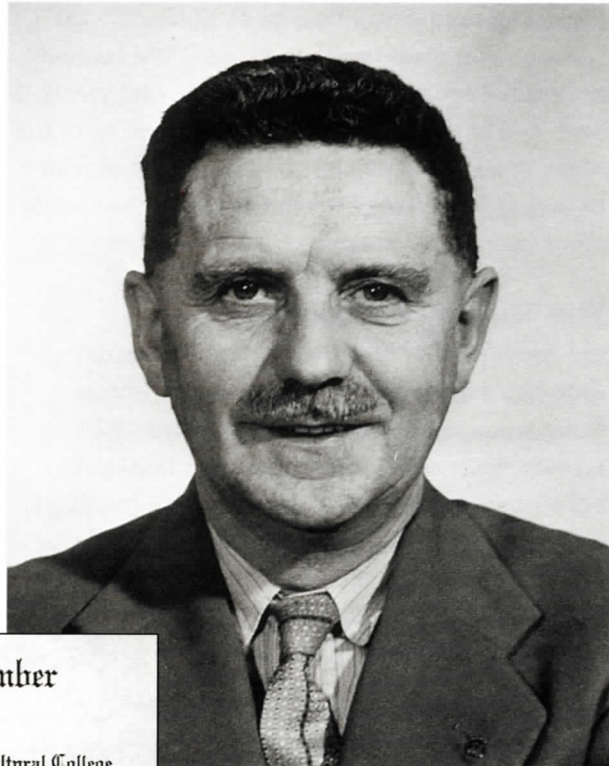
SAGA Highlights

January 1935

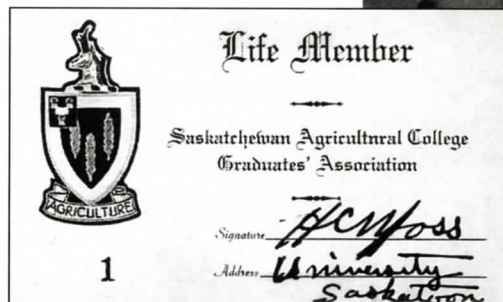
In Sol Sinclair's room in the Bessborough Hotel during U of S Farm and Home Week a group of ag grads formulated the ideas and ideals that would soon become the Saskatchewan Agricultural College Graduates Association. The group included L. "Gus" Bell, Murray S. Cooke, Maurice E. Hartnett, Ian S. McArthur, O.R. "Red" Mooney and John Mitchell.

May 10, 1935

Room 104 College Building (now Administration Building) The first formal meeting of the Saskatchewan Agricultural College Graduates Association. There were 32 grads at the meeting and John Mitchell was elected as the first president.

January 1940

The first Ag Grad Lecture Series was held. The original objective was that the lectures would be a refresher course for ag grads. In 1941, the lecture series joined the University Farm and Home Week. In the early years the Ag Grad Lecture Series was held on Monday and Tuesday of Farm and Home Week, but in later years it was held on Friday morning.

The last lecture series was held in 1991. At that time the University decided to move Farm and Home Week to February so classroom space would be readily available. SAGA and other organizations that were part of Farm and Home Week (Ag Societies, Seed Growers, Canola Growers, Pulse Growers) decided that January was the time to hold the event and went on their own to start "Crop Production Week" headquartered at the Saskatoon Inn.

At the turn of the century Crop Production Week is flying high and draws thousands of farmers to Saskatoon for a cold week in January. The February University Farm and Home Week lasted one year and died. And so it was proven that the original Farm and Home Week lasted 59 years because of the organizations that were part of it, not because of the specific program that was presented.

The Tommy Fraser Award

The Tommy Fraser Memorial Trophy was instituted in 1940 as a tribute to Flight Lieutenant Thomas Grant Fraser of the RCAF, who was killed when his Hawker "Hurricane" plane crashed at Mission City, BC, on June 9, 1939. The Saskatchewan Agricultural College Graduates' Association was responsible for the establishment and dedication of the trophy, but contributions towards the memorial came from across Canada.

Tommy Fraser was born April 28, 1913, in India. He left India at an early age to take his elementary education under the disciplinary conditions of English boarding school and came to Canada as a "boy immigrant" in 1930. He graduated from the University of Saskatchewan in 1936 with a B.S.A. in Agriculture. He had many admirable qualities, his prowess and sports-

manship on the athletic field, and friendly personality were most noteworthy.

The factors considered in making the annual award and the winners over time are reported in the Honors and Awards chapter further along in this book.

The Ag Grad Banquet and Dance

A dinner was part of the annual meeting almost from the beginning. The King George Hotel was an early venue but then the Bessborough Hotel was home for many years. The first dance in conjunction with the banquet was in 1946 at the Bessborough. The Kenny Peaker band was popular and they insisted on playing in the banquet room rather than the ballroom.

People go to a banquet and dance today and a cash bar is taken completely for granted. It was not always so. For many years, a room was rented on another floor and anyone wishing to partake of the sauce checked their bottle in that room and slipped up for a sip as required or desired.

In the early years the banquet was held on Tuesday night. The banquet committee was always challenged by the need to sell sufficient tickets to make it break even. Farm and Home Week in early years had several banquets - the ag grad banquet on Tuesday night, the Seed Growers on Wednesday and the Ag Societies on Thursday. Enterprising ag grads would make sure they were at the Farm and Home Week cafeteria on Monday and ask all comers "Have you got your banquet tickets". When they said no, the ag grads quickly sold them a ticket to their banquet- it was the first of the week so they usually managed to sell quite a few tickets. Ag grads have always been charged with an entrepreneurial spirit!

Probably the high point of the Ag Grad Banquet and dance was the late 1970s and early 1980s. It was held in the Saskatoon Centennial Auditorium and attendance ran up to as much as 850. It was the time when the big classes of 1948 and 1949 were celebrating their 30 years and those reunion years swelled attendance. The formal head table party made a grand entrance to steady applause by the assembled group. It was a class act and a pleasure to be a part of.

January, 1946

The first Ag Grad Bonspiel was held with eight rinks competing. By 1952 there were 35 rinks in what had become an annual classic. In 1959, 46 rinks entered.

As ag grads began to age, some of the older crowd were tired of getting licked by the young pups, so they decided to start a veterans' event. The age to qualify to enter the veteran's event was set at 48 years. The reason for setting the age at such an odd number has been the subject of considerable speculation over the years. The most plausible explanation is that 48 years was the age of Ernie Silzer the year the veteran's event was established and also the year Ernie was running the bonspiel. He set the age.

The Ag Grad Bonspiel continues to this day and is an important part of the annual reunion activities. Class rinks are common. The 'Forever Young' theme is nowhere as obvious as on the curling ice. For example, in the 1999 bonspiel the rink of Lloyd Reddick, made up of four 50 year grads, were runners-up in the Veteran's event.

January 1953

The first bonspiel Smoker was held at the Sergeant's Mess, Exhibition grounds. Early Smokers were very informal affairs - a few buns and some deer meat was the fare, accompanied by lots of good fun and fellowship. The Smoker enjoyed many venues over the years including Intercontinental Packers, the upstairs lounge in the Exhibition Rink (demolished in 1997),

the upstairs lounge in the Exhibition curling rink (now Emerald Casino), Marquis Hall at the U of S and now Saskatoon Inn.

The upstairs lounge in the Exhibition Stadium was a long narrow room. In Smokers of the 60s and 70s, you left your cigarettes at home because cigars were provided by the organizing committee. The air was so thick it could be cut with a knife and one could barely see the length of the room. Booze flowed freely and a good time was guaranteed. The committee was also responsible for seeing that decks of cards were available. Poker games broke out at random and lasted until the unruly patrons were tossed out at closing time. Hadley van Vliet, Bill Ewert, Ernie Silzer were sure to be found in a game and in later years were joined by Keith Ayres, Frank Bond, Frank Dunlop and a host of others.

For many years Smokers were male only events, a reflection of the time when almost all ag grads were males. To accommodate spouses, wives of Saskatoon based ag grads would open their homes to ladies from outside Saskatoon. Eventually, that evolved to a "Smokette" that was held at a venue not far from the Smoker and for the same time period.

Finally, in 1979 the Smoker and smokette were combined into one function and soon after the genders joined the name was changed to "Mixer" - a sign of the times when society began to recognize the many health hazards of smoking. The current Mixer is held on Friday night at Saskatoon Inn and is a more genteel, yet highly popular non-smoking event.

But the important things remain - ag grads of whatever gender and of very diverse backgrounds can get together to swap yarns and enjoy each other's company. The social reunion and fellowship is what the Saskatchewan Agricultural Graduates Association is all about. The details of how events are organized will change with the times, but the principles of friendship and fun will live on forever.

January 1955

The word "college" was dropped from the association name so it was now the Saskatchewan Agricultural Graduates' Association: The new name has stuck to this day.

High Tea in January. Only in Saskatoon at the Ag Grad Reunion You Say. Pity.

In days gone by the annual ag grad reunion was organized differently. The bonspiel was held the weekend before Farm and Home Week, a "TEA" was held on Sunday, the annual meeting and lecture series were Monday and Tuesday and the banquet and dance was Tuesday evening.

A highlight of the reunion was the Sunday tea. It was "THE" social event of the year – very formal and a chance for people from the country to meet the agriculture faculty. And, a chance for ag grads from near and far to renew acquaintances. The best silverware and china were in place, all in attendance were dressed up 'fit to kill' and the tea was poured with grand decorum. The wife of the Dean of Agriculture was prominent at the tea table and the University president was bound to be in attendance.

The June 1967 edition of SAGA reported on the January 1967 ag grad tea as follows:

"As usual the Sunday tea was the place to meet old friends and make new ones. Over 250 ag grads and their wives were welcomed by President Phil and Anita Thair and tea convenors Eiler and Jean Humbert. The long tea table was centered with white chrysanthemums and blue iris, with silvered wheat stalks complemented with blue candles set in clusters of blue and white mums. Tea honors were performed by Mesdames W.G. Milne, L.G. Putnam, C.R. Parsons, and A.J. Sawatsky. Serviteurs were Mesdames D.H. Dabbs, C. Piercy, L.G. Sonmor, H.A. Riddell, G. Jones, D.R. Grant, K.G. Reid, G.E. Racine, D.M. Warren, G.A. Hymers, F.J.H. Fredeen, W.A. Ewert and A. Delahey. Tending the register were Mrs. G.A. Ledingham and Mrs. John Mitchell. General convenors Eiler and Jean Humbert were assisted by Keith and Edna Downey."

The Ag Grad tea was well reported in the Saskatoon Star Phoenix and the Western Producer with photos of some of the executive as standard fare.

The most common location was the upper MUB (Memorial Union Building). It was held in 1973 at the Western Development Museum in conjunction with the opening of the Saskatchewan Agricultural Hall of Fame.

The final tea was held at the Sheraton Cavalier Hotel in 1975. When Farm and Home Week was switched around so the ag grad reunion and lecture series was on Friday and the banquet and dance on Saturday, the Sunday tea became anti-climatic and faded away into history. But, its place in history is well recorded and preserved.

January 1957

A monumental decision was made at that meeting. It was decided that the class of each ten year period since graduation would be recognized and that the class of the 20 year period since graduation be the honor year. Thus, in 1958 the grads of 1938 would be honored and at the same time the grads of 1948, 1928, and 1918 would be recognized. That tradition has been carried on into the new millennium and is probably in large measure responsible for our success in having a successful reunion every year. By focusing the efforts to specific 10 year classes, individual classes have a real incentive to get organized and have a reunion that is for their very own class. The individual 10 year groups organize their own event, usually on Thursday or Friday and then take part in the larger ag grad banquet and dance on Saturday night.

January 1972

The decision was made to place SAGA historical material in the University Archives in the University library. That momentous decision made it possible to publish "Historical Review and Register of Graduates" in 1980 and this historical account as a millennium project. Jack McFaull anchored the archives development effort and got a lot of help from other grads and University Archives staff.

1976

The Ernie McKenzie Public Speaking award was established to recognize high standing in public speaking classes in the College and School. The award was a memorial to the late E.W. McKenzie.

1978

SAGA supported the College of Agriculture and the Saskatchewan Institute of Agrologists in presenting briefs to the Government of Saskatchewan for additional space and staff for the College of Agriculture.

A vigorous membership campaign swelled the SAGA membership to 1609 – an all time record.

1980

The "Historical Review and Register of Graduates" book was published with 1000 copies being printed.

1981

SAGA members endorsed the Sodbuster Club idea and donor support for a new Agriculture Building.

1986

The famous SAGA "Smoker" became history as the name was changed to "Mixer".

1988

Sod turning for the new Agriculture Building, U of S, took place on November 11, 1988.

1989

The first hockey tournament as part of reunion activities included 10 teams of 16 players each. The hockey tournament has become a popular part of annual SAGA reunion activities each January.

1991

The last Ag Grads Lecture Series was held on January 11 in room 129 Thorvaldson. The topic was "The Story of GRIP and NISA" and 100 were in attendance.

The last January Farm and Home Week (The 59th annual) was held in 1991. The university moved Farm and Home Week to February for 1992 over the objections of SAGA and other organizations that were part of Farm and Home Week. The February Farm and Home Week lasted one year and died.

October 25, 1991

The official opening was held for the new Agriculture Building at the U of S.

1994

Kim Harder (Oram) was elected Vice-President of SAGA and she became the first female SAGA president in 1995.

1997

The last thread to Farm and Home Week was broken when the 62nd annual meeting of SAGA was moved to the Saskatoon Inn.

1999

SAGA prepares to enter the next millennium in style. Newsletter editor Jack Braidek reported that he has established an e-mail link so newsletter information can be received more easily.

Ag Grads Make a Difference

Social activities and maintaining contact with fellow grads is the main function of SAGA. But the association has access to a broad range of talents and they don't back away from a challenge or a chance to make a real difference when it comes to the University of Saskatchewan or the agricultural industry in Saskatchewan.

College of Agriculture Advisory Council

The College of Agriculture Advisory Council is a group of representatives from important Saskatchewan farm organizations. It meets April and November each year directly with the Dean of Agriculture and provides advice to the dean and other university officials.

The SAGA first obtained a seat on the Advisory Council in 1946 with Rupert D. Ramsay as our first representative.

SAGA has always made an energetic contribution to the deliberations of the Council and has never backed away from a good scrap. There have been times when our membership has been questioned. In 1959 SIA suggested that SAGA should give up its membership to SIA. The argument was that a professional organization rather than a fraternal organization could more effectively represent agricultural interests. Our response was thanks but no thanks and we wished SIA luck in getting a seat. In due course SIA was invited to sit on the council.

The 1974 annual meeting recorded much heated discussion as the association had been advised that it would no longer have membership on the Advisory Council. The meeting left instructions to write a strong letter of protest to the Dean of Agriculture and the University Board of Governors. The letters must have worked because we are still on the Advisory Council and we still make a difference.

Senate of the University of Saskatchewan

The SAGA has for many years played an active role in nominating rural people to a seat on the University Senate. The senate is set up with geographic repre-

sentation from all of Saskatchewan and who better than ag grads to know potential candidates in the rural areas.

At the 1954 annual meeting the executive drew to the attention of the membership that there were vacancies coming up on the senate and that SAGA should nominate strong candidates to fill those positions.

In recent years Bob McKercher has been instrumental in shaking the trees in ag grad circles to find ag grads willing to serve on Senate. Very few senate elections take place without the name of an ag grad on the ballot.

The ag grads were also instrumental in getting diploma grads admitted to convocation so they were then eligible to be elected Chancellor. Ted Turner '485 was a popular chancellor that resulted from that initiative.

The SAGA also supported Ross Greenshields '49C in his bid for Chancellor in 1980 and Hedley Auld earlier in the century.

Curriculum of Degree and Diploma Programs

The SAGA has been active in lobbying the academics for changes they think are warranted in the curriculum. In 1954 a public speaking class was added to the degree program curriculum in part due to the urging of SAGA. Recent major changes to the Diploma program have received significant input from our College Advisory Council rep (Bill Cooper '51S) and others he commandeered in to helping.

Scholarships

The SAGA has been active in procuring money for scholarships in memory of deceased SAGA members who had made a difference in their lifetime. The first John Mitchell Memorial scholarship went to Lynn Thompson of Wolseley in 1959. The first Hadley van Vliet scholarship went to Glen Herndier of Lemberg in 1971.

The 1948 degree graduates have supported the College of Agriculture strongly. When money was

needed for the new Agriculture Building they contributed substantially and their contribution is acknowledged in a plaque on the door of the undergrad applied microbiology teaching laboratory. The class has also provided eight scholarships totalling \$15,000 to second and third year degree students.

Sodbusters Club

In 1984 Ross Greenshields and Leo Kristjanson were instrumental in starting the "Sodbusters Club". The Sodbusters Club was to include persons dedicated to seeing a new Agriculture Building at the U of S. The goal was 100 people who would donate \$1000 each to provide seed money to pay for conceptual plans for a new Agriculture Building. SAGA provided support to the project and many ag grads joined the Sodbusters Club. It actually was oversold and the enthusiasm of the sodbuster idea was a major factor in keeping the project in the minds of politicians long enough to bring the building to reality.

Barn Raisers

In recent years SAGA has spearheaded a Barn Raisers Club to raise money to save the U of S stone barn. The money raised will be used to determine various possible functional uses for the barn

Recognition of Diploma Grads

The SAGA helped to negotiate with SIA to obtain recognition of diploma grads. In 1998 SIA established an affiliate membership as Agricultural Technologist.

All in the Family and Some Notable Firsts

The life of an Agro or VocAg is often a family affair. When one member of a family finds out how good it is, others soon follow.

The record for the most Agros from one immediate family goes to the LaForge family of Arborfield, SK. Art, Martin, Andre, Cyril and Monique all graduated with a BSA and for good measure, Leon was a diploma grad.

The Beaulieu family of Indian Head boasts five ag grads; father Vic '49C, daughter Denise and sons Karl, Paul, Mark, all with BSA degrees.

The Flaten family name is prominent in lists of ag grads. Glenn graduated from the diploma program in 1950 and with a degree in 1956. Sons Murray, Wayne and Gordon are also grads. Glenn's brother Delbert graduated in 1957 and his sons Gary and Raymond are ag grads. Norman, another brother, graduated in engineering, but we will excuse him for that because three of his children, Don, Brent and Patricia are all ag grads.

Two families are tied for the most female degree grads. The Oram family of Central Butte had three female degree ag grads – Judy (MacMillan), Kathy (Martin) and Kim (Harder).

The Oram family has ag grad records going back a long way – their grandfather Len Bryan was a Grad of 1915. From Len Bryan to date the Oram connection has 11 souls who have passed through the hallowed halls of U of S.

The Lowndes family of Kelvington also has three female ag grads. Twin sisters Susan Lowndes and Sandra Lowndes were followed by Kerry (Hauer) Lowndes. The Lowndes girls came by it honestly – their father Glen was a degree grad of 1958.

Three generations of grads is also known. A.A. (Spike) Smith '15S, A.G.(Bud) Smith '48C and Keith Smith '77S make up one such connection.

The Rugg family of the Colonsay area have supplied many ag grads. A three generation connection includes Barry Rugg '48S, Bob Rugg '71C and Brian Rugg '97C. And the Rugg family also counts in Alan Rugg '42C and his son Don '66C.

Two generations of SAGA presidents is also worthy of note – Spike Smith and his son Bud Smith were presidents as were Art Delahey and his son Rod Delahey.

And brothers have also been SAGA presidents: Jock Blacklock in 1958 and Ben Blacklock in 1965.

The first MSc graduate of the U of S was Arthur W. Henry '17C of Milden. His cousin's son Les Henry, also of Milden, was a degree grad of 1964.

The first female ag grad was Margaret Georgina Landes 'C36 of Langham who went on to be the first female MSc grad in 1937.

The first female diploma grad was Irene Agnes Theresa Doll 'S43 (Cosford) of Aylsham.

The first female president of SAGA was Kim (Oram) Harder. She was a degree grad of 1983 and was president in 1995.

Leadership

LEADERSHIP OVER THE YEARS: Starting a new organization requires the initiative of a core of inspired people, but the real test is to find people who will step forward to run the outfit once organized. SAGA attracted capable volunteers from its membership ranks to assume the various offices at the outset and the tradition of members volunteering or agreeing to 'take their turn' in office continues to this day. Along the way SAGA also attracted a few from outside the organization. More about those supportive 'outsiders' later.

The Presidents

John Mitchell '24C, who had been an active proponent in forming the association was elected at the May 10, 1935 founding meeting and he served for two years in that office. The practice of serving two years as president happened eight times in the first 20 years, but serving one year only has been the practice since. A vice president, often a person with experience on the board of directors, is elected each year and that individual moves up to be president the following year. The past president also serves on the board, providing experience, understanding and an element of continuity.

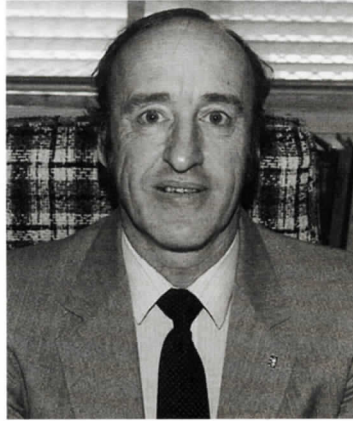

Other Executive Members

In the beginning the secretary was also the treasurer, registrar and editor of the newsletter. As time went on the trend was toward involving more people to do the various jobs. Since 1991 one person has handled each of secretary, treasurer, registrar and editor duties.

Multiple Office Holders

In the first 15 years of the organization a single person handled the four offices of secretary, treasurer, registrar and newsletter editor. The dedicated grads who assumed those multiple tasks were, Vic Graham, Clarence Spence, Howard McDonald, Ralph Stutt, Bob Bibbey, Bill Baker and Joe Zeman. For most of the period 1950 to 1990 the offices of secretary and treasurer were held by one person, with others handling each of the editor and registrar jobs.

Those who served as secretary treasurers are Maury Taylor, Al Myhr, Oral Young, Eiler Humbert, Frank Sosulski, Roy Crawford, Bob McKercher, Herb Clark, Frank Dunlop, Les McLean, Ken Bassendowski, Ross Kingdon and Baine Fritzler.

Registrar: Joe Zeman, Maury Taylor, Steve Burkell, Murray Riddell, Don Acton, Keith Vick, Art Wenhardt, and since 1974 by Richard Bellamy. It is noted that Bellamy's 26 years of service as registrar is the longest period of any office-holder in SAGA history. Richard maintains the SAGA membership list and works closely with the University Alumni office in securing mailing labels for every newsletter.

Auditors

SAGA has had an auditor check the financial records every year since its formation, when it received \$109.25 and spent \$49.89 in the first year, to the present when annual cash flow is more than \$30,000 and the organization assets exceed \$80,000.

Six individuals have gratuitously audited the books over the 65 years. J.H. Thompson, Dean of Commerce audited the books for the first 17 years. He was succeeded as auditor by Jack Pringle, University Comptroller, for the next 19 years. Bill Ewert did the audit a couple of years, then Doug Wilkinson stepped up and served as auditor for the next 19 years, to 1991. Darryl Reynolds and Lorence Peterson have taken turns at audit the last eight years. The long-term contribution of member-auditors is appreciated and the association is most grateful to the non-member auditors Thompson and Pringle.

THE SAGA

The first executive of the SAGA were a shrewd lot. They reckoned that if the organization was to survive and serve the membership it would need some way to communicate with a far-flung membership. So a newsletter was born on May 10, 1935, coincident with the first formal meeting of the organization. Publication of the newsletter has continued over the years with issue No. 225 being mailed to the membership in December 1999.

The primary purpose of *THE SAGA* was, and is, to be a communicative link between the grads and their alma mater, but over time it has taken on a few other chores, one of which is that of historian, the pages reminding us of the many activities of the grads and their organization as well as the comings and goings at our college and university. Gleanings from those pages penned over the years by the editors form a part of this section and of others in this book.

The Editors

Someone had to do it and the organization is indebted to a succession of budding editors who took on the job. In fact, 31 grads have served as editors or assistant editors over the first 65 years of the life of the publication. Perhaps the large number of editors is inversely related to the job pay!

Vic Graham '27C, later dean of the college, was the first secretary-treasurer and editor of the *Ag Grad Circular*, as it was called for many years. He created and saw that the first nine issues were delivered or sent to the grads in 1935 and 1936. He set the pattern for the first 30 years, during

which the newsletter was from two to six pages of close type, sometimes on 8.5 x 11 inch stock, and sometimes on 14 inch length pages. No doubt many of the early-day letters were reproduced on hand cranked duplicating machines, collated, stapled and addressed by hand. Today the pages are spun out effortlessly by an offset press and mechanically collated and stapled into book form.

Graham was followed as secretary-treasurer and editor by Clarence Spence '29C, who was employed with the Dominion Economics group in Saskatoon. He served as editor from March 1937 to December 1945 and was responsible for 33 issues of the newsletter. Entomologist Howard McDonald '31S, '36C was the editor in 1941 and 1942, then was succeeded by Ralph Stutt '33C, who had succeeded Spence as head of the federal economics group at Saskatoon. Ralph held the editor position for ten issues, escaping from that job by becoming president of SAGA in 1946.

From 1946 to 1977, 26 grads served as editors, co-editors or assistant editors. A few of the editors held office briefly, others came to feel the effect of deadlines on multiple occasions. They are (alphabetically) Bill Baker '44C, Ben Blacklock '46C, Bob Brack '52C, Steve Burkell '49C, Herb Clark '45C, Dave Christensen '58C, Keith Downey '50C, Glen Farrell '59C, Hartley Fredeen '43C, Bernie Goplen '52C, Ross Greenshields '49C, Ken Gronsdahl '51S, Tom Homersham '28S, R.P. (Bob) Knowles '41C, Cecilia (Kohlman) Mulhern '75C, Dave Mallough '47C, Bill Miner '52C, Don Rennie '49C, Murray Riddell '49C, A.A. (Spike) Smith '15S, Art Stilborn '41C, Walter Van Haerlem '43C, Keith

Vick '56C, Jake Wiens '49C, Bill Wilson '40C, Joe Zeman '44C. Many of these had a short run as editor, others, notably Ben Blacklock, Herb Clark, Dave Christensen and Joe Zeman edited ten or more issues during that 22 year period.

Lin Boyes '48C brought a wealth of talent and experience to the task of editor. His reputation for crafting a very readable newsletter was established in the Wynyard district, where he had served as ag. rep. To this was added his experience with *Grainews*. Lin's issues were newsy and fun

to read, but he contributed far more. He developed the size and style of the newsletter which is still used today. He livened it up with great writing and lots of graphics. He changed the name from "The Saskatchewan Agricultural Graduates Newsletter" to *THE SAGA*, and as he stated, "which nomenclature alludes to both the initials of the organization and to the avowed intention to publish the story, a saga, of the activities of the membership." He mischievously added, "the term 'saga' also implies that strict adherence to fact is not a requirement of content." Failing health forced Lin to give up the editorship in June 1991 and he died on December 4 of that year, but his dedicated editorship and engaging personality live on in the memories of those who knew him.

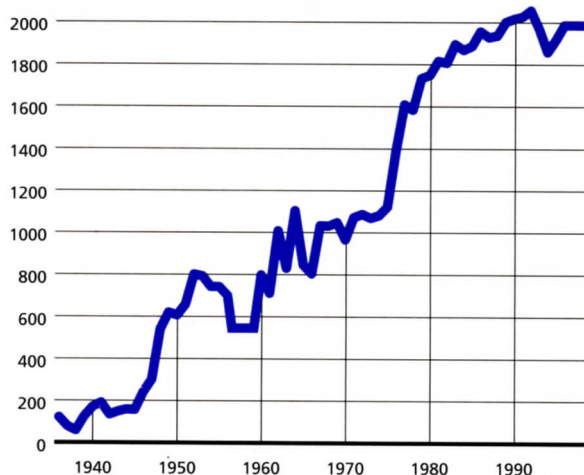

in part because newspapering with *The Western Producer* was an enjoyable job for him for fifteen years before retirement. But also because he finds it satisfying to be of service to a great organization.

During this period, *THE SAGA* has changed from four issues per year of up to twelve pages to three of sixteen pages to reduce the cost yet maintain reasonable contact between members and their organization. The use of photographs in the newsletter, pioneered in 1961, has been increased substantially in recent years. In 1999, the editor acquired an internet number (thesaga@home.com) and this new link has encouraged communication between members and their publication.

The focus of *THE SAGA* has remained much as it was in the early days. Information about the grads is of primary importance, even with the problems of gathering the news. News about the activities of SAGA and reports on activities in the college and university follow in importance. Somewhat less emphasis has been placed on developments in the agricultural industry.

THE SASKATCHEWAN AGRICULTURAL GRADUATES' ASSOCIATION is an organization of the alumni of the degree and diploma programs at the College of Agriculture, University of Saskatchewan. Constitutional changes on membership classification over the years allow for admission of graduates of other colleges, University of Saskatchewan and graduates in agriculture from other universities in Canada, United States and other countries.

The Association also has an honorary life membership classification, and a slate of officers elected at the annual meeting. The Association has a constitution and bylaws and is registered in Saskatchewan under the Societies Act.

Although the first formal meeting held May 10, 1935 of the present association is well documented and commemorated by a plaque in the now Administration Building of the University of Saskatchewan, the idea of an agricultural alumni association as a separate independent group came earlier. During University of Saskatchewan Farm and Home Week, 1935, L. "Gus" Bell, Murray S. Cooke, Maurice E. Hartnett, Ian S. McArthur, O.R. "Red" Mooney, and John Mitchell, met socially with Sol Sinclair in his room at the Bessborough Hotel. These people, mostly graduates of the early 30's, realized the opportunity for good fellowship and reacquaintance offered by their chance gathering could well be perpetuated to everyone's advantage. It was as a result of this meeting that this small group determined to find out if the idea would be favorably received by other graduates. Their initiative met with the success chronicled on the following pages about this Association.

The Saskatchewan Agricultural Graduates' Association, originally named the Saskatchewan Agricultural College Graduates Association, was formed May 10, 1935 at a meeting held in Room 104, College Building, University of Saskatchewan. There were thirty-two men in attendance at the founding meeting. A review of archive material and personal contact with a number of graduates who were in attendance at this inaugural meeting provides the following list of those in attendance.

Dr. John Mitchell acted as chairman and Rupert D. Ramsay as secretary. A draft of the first constitution was presented. It was moved by J. Campbell Hackney and seconded by Tom Townley-Smith that the constitution be adopted. Carried. The annual fee of \$1 was also approved at this meeting.

The new organization was born and running. A commemorative plaque has been placed near the door of Room 104, Administration Building (College Building) to identify the place of origin of the Association.

THE INITIAL YEAR - 1935

The first executive meeting of the Association was held on May 13, 1935 with John Mitchell, M.E. Hartnett, Hadley Van Vliet, Hal McCallum, Howard McDonald and Vic E. Graham in attendance. An interesting aspect of this meeting was the proposal to promise a regular news letter to the membership and to find out if grads were still looking for employment. There was a suggestion that the fee could be reduced in the future.

The annual membership fee in 1935 was \$1 for degree graduates, and 50¢ for diploma graduates. This fee structure remained in effect for many years. It was raised to \$2 in 1969 and to \$4 in 1979. The Constitution of the Association and the objectives were established during the first year of operation. The wisdom of those who drew up the constitution and particularly the objectives is supported by the fact that the original objectives have received very few major revisions.

The first annual meeting, which took the form of a dinner meeting was attended by forty-six members on January 14, 1936 at the Oak Room, King George Hotel. Dr. Walter C. Murray, first president of the University of Saskatchewan was guest speaker. The

newsletter urged graduates to join, but also asked business organizations to employ graduates. The revenue for the first year of operation was \$109.25, and expenses were \$49.89. A roll call at the first annual meeting indicated that all grad years 1915-1935 were represented except for 1915 and 1919. It should be remembered that Saskatchewan was still in the throes of the drought years, and jobs were hard to find. The association, therefore, made strong appeal to business organizations and other institutions to hire graduates of the College of Agriculture.

Dr. Walter C. Murray, in his address to the meeting, urged the graduates to promote the meaning of the University of Saskatchewan and not just the College of Agriculture. He was concerned that the alumni of the college would become a splinter group of the total university alumni. He said "Agricultural students should recognize the fact that they are firstly, alumni of the university and secondly, of the College of Agriculture". He further stated that: "He wanted to avoid any schism in the alumni of the University and the College of Agriculture".

Dr. Murray made a number of very important statements in his address which have had far reaching results and implications for the university and the College of Agriculture. He emphasized the significance of the College of Agriculture in the design and building of the University of Saskatchewan. He stated "that a decision was made to make the College of Agriculture an integral part of the University of Saskatchewan and that academic standards set up in the agricultural college were exactly the same as other faculties. The soundness of this policy was the quick recognition of the qualifications of Saskatchewan graduates in agriculture and other provinces have since adopted the Saskatchewan plan." Dr. Murray praised the founders of the Association and wished them the very best in their endeavours. The meeting discussed the matter of honorary members and life members. The entire executive was returned to office, in addition, Murray Cooke, Regina; C.C. Spence, Saskatoon and A.D. Davey, Moose Jaw, were added to the executive.

The Association executive reported to the meeting that they tried to find employment for graduates,

that 1300 circular letters were sent out to members and in addition, 67 letters were written on business matters. It is interesting to record the financial status of the Association, December 31, 1935 especially when compared to the financial picture 65 years later.

There was considerable concern that major employers were not hiring agricultural graduates. During a September 4, 1935 meeting, the executive agreed to write the Dean of Agriculture, the Deputy Minister of Agriculture, the Agricultural Commissioner of Saskatchewan, the Civil Service of Saskatchewan, the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool, the Saskatchewan Live-stock Producers Ltd., the Canadian Society of Technical Agriculturists and others to find out more about the employment of Agricultural Graduates and to inform them of the services of the Saskatchewan Agricultural College Graduates' Association. It was obvious from the tone of the early executive meetings of the association that job opportunities for Agro grads were rather scarce during the 1930's and remained so until the outbreak of the second world war in 1939.

The growth of the Association membership during the initial year was quite dramatic, an executive meeting on November 25, 1935 reported 114 members and a bank balance of \$63 An interesting note from this meeting stated that the cost for the dinner be kept to a maximum of 50¢ per person. Mr. J.H. Thompson, Dean of the College of Commerce was asked to audit the books of the Association. He continued to audit the books up to 1951, and never asked for any payment. The Association, in due time, gave him a \$10 honorarium and a letter of appreciation.

1936

Only three executive meetings were held in 1936. An important decision was made in membership classification in 1936. The executive agreed to have all members under one classification whether they were graduates of the College (degree) or the School (associate).

There was considerable discussion as to whether a person could become a member after having spent three years in the College but was not a graduate. A motion to this effect was defeated - the side note to the reasoning was as follows: "A student may have spent a number of years in the College and then was found academically unfit. The executive should retain full power to veto applications for membership from those who have not obtained a degree or diploma." The first suggestion of candidates for honorary life membership in the Association appears in the December meeting of the executive. Four names were put forth, Dr. F.H. Auld; Hon. J.G. Taggart, Dean A.M. Shaw and Kenneth Campbell.

1937

The second annual meeting was held, January 12, 1937 at the Oak Room, King George Hotel with 45

members in attendance. Professor J.W.G. MacEwan, Department of Animal Science was guest speaker. His topic "Romance of Agriculture". Dr. Walter C. Murray, President of the University of Saskatchewan spoke on the importance of the strong unity between the University of Saskatchewan alumni and the alumni of the Saskatchewan Agricultural College Graduates' Association. He stated: "This does not exist in larger alumni groups". Dr. Murray urged graduates to encourage more students to enroll in the two year associate course. He also indicated that conditions were very crowded at the University. There was a suggestion that a low cost school be established on the campus for associate students and that there be better entrance scholarships from the farm boys camps at the summer exhibitions for students. The association discussed the possibility of establishing entrance scholarships to the associate course and agreed to campaign for more students.

A revolving loan fund of \$200 was established for University of Saskatchewan School of Agriculture students, the maximum loan to be \$40 each one for not more than one year. The loan committee consisted of J.B. Harrington, E.E. Brockelbank and J.R. Klinck. Dr. L.E. Kirk was appointed Dean of the College of Agriculture and J.W.G. MacEwan was appointed Director of the School of Agriculture in 1937.

1938

Sixty-five graduates were in attendance at the third annual meeting of the SACGA held at the King George Hotel, January 11, 1938. The Association had a bank balance of \$112.11, from which \$10 was given to the stadium fund, a practice which was carried out for a number of years. The Association assisted 24 graduates to find employment.

The annual meeting witnessed a heated debate on the amount of the entrance scholarship(s) to the associate course. The meeting could not agree whether the scholarship should be \$50 or \$30. The decision was left up to the new executive.

Guest speakers included Dr. J.S. Thomson, President of the University of Saskatchewan, Dr. L.E. Kirk and George A. Robertson, Secretary of the Saskatchewan

Wheat Pool. Dr. J.S. Thomson said: "You are trained in Agriculture, and it is the lot of those present to carry to the people the knowledge they possess so the future might be faced hopefully." It was quite a challenge, but emphasized the importance which the president placed on agriculture and university extension. Dr. L.E. Kirk said: "The need for a dormitory at the University for short course students was keenly felt and I foresee the day when 200-300 students would be enrolled in the College". Dr. Kirk had to wait 10 years to see his dream come true with the completion of Kirk Hall in 1949. George Robertson said "Never sell Saskatchewan short". He had tremendous faith in the potential of this province. Fraternal spirit was strong as indicated by the use of the College and University yells at the close of the program.

The executive agreed that three \$30 scholarships would be made available to students entering the associate course, with the candidates to be selected from those attending the farm boys camps at the summer exhibitions.

The price of a banquet ticket for the annual meeting was set at 50¢ and it was agreed to invite second year associate course students, senior year degree students and the three scholarship students to the banquet. The scholarship students were the only ones to receive complimentary tickets. Tommy Fraser, the person to whom the "Tommy Fraser Memorial Trophy" recognizes, was killed June 8, 1938 at Mission, BC while he was flying for the RCAF.

1939

The fourth annual meeting was held January 10, 1939 at the King George Hotel. Seventy-five graduates and 10 students from the graduating class attended. An interesting item in the audit report was that recognition be given to Jacob Wilner for his special contribution of \$1 to the Association. The Association awarded three \$30 entrance scholarships in 1938 to the University Farm School. A roll call was taken and only three years between 1915 and 1938 were not represented at this meeting. This was the largest

number of graduating classes to be represented to date. New objectives were agreed upon.

- a) to promote the social interests of the graduates of the College of Agriculture, University of Saskatchewan.
- b) to promote closer relationships among graduates and the college, including both faculty and students.
- c) to assist whenever possible in securing positions for graduates of the college.
- d) to co-operate with University Alumni Association in their efforts to promote the interests of the University as a whole.

An expression of sympathy was made at the 1939 annual meeting on the death of one of the first agricultural graduates, Arthur John Fahl, 1915. This tradition of remembering deceased grads has continued to this day.

Dr. Walter C. Murray, the first President of the University and a long time supporter of the College of Agriculture was unable to attend because of illness. Guest speakers were Dr. J.S. Thomson, University President, Mr. John Vallance, Water Development Branch, PFRA and Professor A.H. Ewen, Department of Animal Science.

The first suggestion of a refresher course or lecture series for graduates was made at the 1939 annual meeting by Murray Cooke. The executive followed up this suggestion and proceeded to plan for a graduate lecture program in 1940. This was a very significant decision because graduate lecture programs became an important part of the ag grad reunions and annual meeting.

A committee was appointed to look into a memorial for Tommy Fraser. Harold Horner was named chairman, Stan Tallman, Gordon Racine, Walter Burns and Tom McLeod as members with power to add.

The first recipients for the SACGA entrance scholarships to the School of Agriculture were Colin R. Bird, Sidney D. Bird, J. Morris Eastman and Maurice E. Taylor. The annual membership fee was established at \$1 for Degree and 50¢ for Associate graduates.

1940

The fifth annual meeting was held at 6:00 pm in the dining room, King George Hotel with 110 people in attendance. Included in this number were 25 senior degree and diploma students of the College of Agriculture.

The first Ag Grad Lecture Series as a form of update or refresher course for ag grads was held in 1940.

Bill Wilson and Ron Sutherland brought greetings from the degree and diploma students. The meeting agreed that the Ag Grad Lecture Series would become part of the annual University of Saskatchewan Farm and Home Week. The initiation of the election of directors to the executive for one and two year terms first occurred in 1940. Speakers at the annual meeting included Maurice Hartnett, Dr. J.S. Thomson, president of the University of Saskatchewan, E.E. Eisenhower of Regina and John Keay of Moose Jaw.

The Association appointed a committee of John Mitchell, Thos. Rowles and Vic Graham to prepare a history of the college. A special project in the early 1940's was to send the newsletter and parcels to ag grads who were serving overseas in the armed forces.

1941

The second Ag Grad Lecture Series was held in conjunction with University of Saskatchewan Farm and Home Week. The sixth annual meeting and banquet was held at the King George Hotel on the evening of January 14.

An aim of the Association was to keep in touch with all grads, therefore all received the newsletter. A special effort was made to keep in touch with grads serving with Canadian Armed Service Forces overseas, letters, parcels and cigarettes were sent. Grads serving in the armed forces did not need to pay fees.

Ag grad scholarships were awarded to Bill Darcovich of Kuroki, Norman Roebuck of Waldron, and H.A. Riddell of Brownlee.

Dr. J.F. Leddy, President of the University of Saskatchewan Alumni spoke to the grads. He said: "Apprehension was felt on the part of some when the Agricultural Graduates' Association was organized, due to the establishing of a separate college alumni. It was felt by some that such an organization was not conducive to the strength of the University Alumni. The fear, however, had proven groundless, as a matter of fact, the Association has been a help in the building of a stronger alumni organization. Those active in the SAGA were among the most faithful supporters of the University of Saskatchewan Alumni."

Eleven ag grads have been president of the University of Saskatchewan Alumni: Gus Bell, Murray Riddell, Vic Graham, Walter Brice, Herb Dow, Glenn Hass, Lawrence Kirk, John Cameron, Henry Saville, Maurice Hartnett and Gordon Wilson.

The Association agreed in 1941 to pay for the purchase and engraving of the miniature trophy in connection with the Tommy Fraser Memorial Award.

1942

The seventh annual meeting was held on January 13, 1942 at the King George Hotel. Sixty grads and faculty were now serving with the armed forces overseas. The third Ag Grad Lecture Series was held prior to the annual meeting. An important resolution to amend the section on membership in the constitution was

made at this meeting. "Any person who had discontinued either degree or diploma course **after two years without receiving a degree or diploma and whose class has since graduated** be added to the category of eligibility for membership." The annual membership fee of \$1 for all eligible members was established. The establishment of members-at-large to the executive was approved at the meeting. Hugh Kidd, Vandura; Vernon Metheral, Weyburn; William Foster, Abernethy and John Klinck, Regina, were elected. The following interesting resolution was also approved.

"Whereas the College of Agriculture did in 1941 at the expense of the College of Engineering, decisively secure the Inter Society Rugby Championship, we the members of the SACGA do hereby record our approval and pleasure in the achievement of our future members."

The banquet speaker was Dr. Ken Neatby, Director of Agricultural Extension Department, Northwest Line Elevators Association, Winnipeg. Dr. Neatby took a constructive critical attitude to the Agricultural College Course curriculum and emphasized that "Agriculture is really applied biology and that the curriculum should therefore be built on a fundamental foundation of biology". Dr. Neatby also stressed the importance of agricultural extension and therefore the necessity for agriculturists to develop the art of imparting their knowledge to the farming public. Dr. Neatby suggested that the lecture series Proceedings, because of their pertinent information, **should be mailed to all members. This was a first.** The meeting approved an honorarium of \$3.50 to Miss G. Hall and \$1 to Miss Shute for the secretarial work they had done for the Association. For the first time in history, the Association bank surplus reached over \$100. The books showed a bank balance of \$100.34.

1943

The eighth annual meeting of the Association, held at the King George Hotel on January 12, 1943, was attended by 106 people including graduates, undergraduates, farmers and visitors. The Ag Grad Lecture Series was held on the afternoon of January 10 and

all day on the 11th. The executive reported that there were 93 graduates serving with the Armed Forces on the continent and overseas. Sirim Grimshaw, Inspector of Aircraft, donated a "Tiger Moth" propeller on which was to be engraved the names of all ag grads who served in the RCAF and RAF during the Second World War. (The propeller is on the campus, but names have not yet been inscribed.)

The guest speaker was W.B. Francis, Saskatoon lawyer, who spoke on "The Development, Objectives and Methods of Co-operative Enterprise in Saskatchewan".

A decision was made at the meeting that one entrance scholarship be given to a student entering the School of Agriculture, the selection to be made through the Boys and Girls Club Work. The \$60 scholarship was awarded to Hugh Taylor of Gainsborough. There was a suggestion that the Association encourage students to attend the college and school.

1944

The ninth annual meeting was held in the Bessborough Hotel on January 11, 1944. A special feature of the annual meeting was a sing song led by Dr. Ken Neatby. Dr. J. S. Thomson, President of the University of Saskatchewan and Vic Graham, President of the University of Saskatchewan Alumni Association spoke to the grads.

Ralph Stutt, secretary-treasurer of the Association, in his report stated: "Since organization of the Association in 1935, the scope of our services has broadened. The fraternal and social aspects have served to maintain a lively interest of all agricultural graduates in the college, and the university." It was noted that there were 139 agros in the various branches of the armed services. A vote of thanks was tendered to W.L. Kerr, Superintendent of the Forestry Farm, Sutherland for the contribution of his books, bulletins and periodicals to the agricultural library.

Dr. W. C. Murray, in speaking to the graduates, stated that since the inception of the degree course in 1912, of the 320 graduates, one-third had taken higher degrees and 48 had completed doctorates. The guest speaker was Captain W. H. Horner who talked about

his two and a half years experience in the Army in Great Britain. There was agreement at the meeting to officially change the name of the lecture series from refresher course to Agricultural Graduate Lectures. There was the suggestion of changing the name of the Association from SACGA to SAGA. An interesting motion was made at the meeting requesting graduates to bring their wives and friends to the next annual meeting.

1945

The tenth annual meeting was held at the Bessborough Hotel on January 9, 1945. The total attendance was 144 consisting of grads, wives and friends. The price of a banquet ticket was \$1.28 and twelve complimentary tickets at a cost of \$15.36 were made available to invited guests. Dr. J.S. Thomson, President of the University of Saskatchewan addressed the meeting. Mr. Lloyd Harris of Yorkton received the \$60 entrance scholarship to the College of Agriculture.

Thirty-six Christmas gift parcels were sent by the Association to grads serving overseas. An historical document written by Thos. Bryden, Manager, University of Saskatchewan Farm entitled **"30 Years with University Livestock"** was distributed to all members. This document is in the SAGA files, University of Saskatchewan archives.

The membership went on record as supporting a memorial to be erected in honour of those University of Saskatchewan alumni who died while serving in the Armed Forces in World War II. Considerable discussion centered on the form that this memorial might take. There was additional discussion on initiating an Honorary Life Membership in the Association during 1944-45. The banquet speaker was Professor J.W.G. MacEwan who spoke on Agricultural Pioneers. The L.E. Kirk trophy for hockey supremacy between the ag. grads and the undergrads was presented. The hockey game was won by the undergrads with a score of 3:2.

The Treasurer reported an income of \$279.33, during the year of which an amount of \$252.85 was derived from the payment of fees. The meeting recorded the

death in 1944 of a dear friend and great supporter of the College of Agriculture, Dr. W. C. Murray, first President of the University of Saskatchewan.

The first Ag Grad Bonspiel, initiated by Benny Murphy, was held on this occasion with Bill Ewert and his rink mates of Joe Zeman, Jack McFaul and Brice Sallans receiving the Championship Kirk Trophy. The first honorary life memberships in the Association were presented to R.D. Kirkham and Tom Brydon.

1946

The 11th annual meeting was held on January 8, 1946 in the Chemistry Theatre, University of Saskatchewan. The lecture series was held on Monday and Tuesday, January 7 and 8. **A dance for the first time followed the annual banquet at the Bessborough.**

The meeting recorded the deaths of Lorne C. Burke, John Arthur Wellbelove, James Zunti, Bert A. Holtby and Doug Knowles who were killed while on active service overseas.

The executive reported that the Association now has **representation on the Advisory Council to the College of Agriculture with Rupert D. Ramsay serving as the first representative.** They also stated "that no other college graduates meet with so much enthusiasm and spirit as the Agros". The executive informed the meeting that Jack B. Rutherford, son of the late Dean Rutherford would give his father's files to the Association. The first signs of illness to Dr. John Mitchell was noted, however, he was well enough to attend the meetings.

It was during 1945 that suggestions were made by the Association to revamp the College of Agriculture and School of Agriculture curricula. Howard Fredeen presented the report for the College and Bill Baker for the School of Agriculture. The report on the revisions to the college curriculum did not meet with much support from Dean L.E. Kirk. He stated "that the revisions suggested would lead to a more scientific course and that we would graduate scientists and not agriculturalists". The courses should remain practical, it was observed. A note in the minutes suggests that Howard Fredeen's report was misrepresented.

It was reported to the meeting that Lloyd Rasmussen visited Tommy Fraser's parents in Valparai, India. The annual meeting revised the constitution to provide for a news editor and assistant secretary. The meeting gave the association executive authority to work on its behalf toward a suitable war memorial. The Line Elevators Farm Service agreed to print the 1946 lecture series for the Association.

An interesting note in the minutes with reference to the 5:30 P.M. adjournment states that "probably a more correct expression would be dissolved or discontinued to prepare for the annual banquet and dance at the Bessborough."

1947

The 12th annual meeting was held on January 7, 1949 in the Chemistry Theatre, University of Saskatchewan and was attended by 71 grads. The banquet and dance were held January 6 at the Bessborough.

The executive reported a number of interesting developments at the 1947 annual meeting. Four newsletters (1900 copies) were distributed at a total cost of \$130. The Association awarded the \$60 entrance scholarship to W.J. Small of Craven. Fifty dollars was given to the Memorial Union Building Fund. There was discussion regarding the establishment of a special program for wives of ag grads, also the idea of a Smoker. Possibly, these two events could be sponsored jointly with the Saskatchewan Institute of Agrologists.

It was agreed that a basic life membership fee of \$20 be established and that it would be reduced by one-half of the annual fees that a member had paid to date. The monies accruing would be invested to earn interest at a rate between 1 1/2 - 3 1/2 percent.

Dr. F.H. Auld was elected an honorary life member of the Association. The ways and means committee suggested that ag grads should be prepared to play a much larger role in the University of Saskatchewan Farm and Home Week.

The Agricultural Students' Association and the Saskatchewan Vocational Agricultural Association appointed student representatives to the ag grad

executive. The representatives were Doug Treleaven, ASA and Vic. Drahtenza, SVAA.

1948

The 13th annual meeting of the Association, held January 6, 1948 in the Chemistry Theatre was attended by 60 members. Dr. Balfour Currie, President of the University of Saskatchewan Alumni addressed the meeting.

Eighteen members have now taken out life memberships in the Association. **Harold C. Moss received No.1 and A.C. Bonnor No.2.** The Association agreed to purchase a trophy for presentation to the outstanding student in the graduating class of the School of Agriculture to be a similar award to the College of Agriculture Tommy Fraser Memorial. The Association approved Professor J.G. Rayner and W.J.F. Warren for honorary life memberships. Two entrance scholarships, each valued at \$50, one to the College and one to the School of Agriculture were approved.

The executive asked the membership to **support** Dr. F.H. Auld for Chancellor of the University of Saskatchewan. A sum of \$25 was approved for expenditure on the campaign. It should be recorded that **Dr. Auld** was later **elected** to the position of **Chancellor** of the University of Saskatchewan.

The Association accepted a degree of responsibility to canvass for the Memorial Union Building. H.R. Clark and W.J. White were appointed to a committee to work with John G. Rayner to study ways and means of improving University of Saskatchewan Farm and Home Week.

An interesting deliberation in 1948 centered on the cost of the annual grads banquet and dance. It was agreed that the price of admission should not exceed \$5. Honorary life memberships in the Association were awarded to Dr. John Mitchell and Dr. L.E. Kirk.

1949

The 14th annual meeting and lecture series was held January 3 and 4, 1949 in the Chemistry Theatre. Seventy-five members were present. The 1948 annual

meeting honored the associate graduates of 1915 to 1920. The executive reported a surplus of \$6 on the banquet and dance. It was agreed to honour all grads of the 1921-22 class at the 1950 reunion. Twenty rinks competed in the Ag Grad Bonspiel. Another trophy, the Rutherford, was being proposed by the Class of 1915. A committee was appointed to investigate the best time to hold the bonspiel. The Association invested \$350 from the life membership account in 9th Victory bonds.

1950

The 15th annual meeting, January 10, 1950 was held in the Auditorium of Kirk Hall with 100 members in attendance. The Ag Grad Bonspiel was held on January 6 and 7 with two new trophies, the Rutherford and Skelly, up for competition. The Rutherford was named in honour of the first Dean of Agriculture and the Skelly after Con Skelly a well known graduate who was killed in an accident in 1945. Five newsletters were published in 1949, the first and last were sent to all graduates of the college and school. The biographies of Dean Rutherford and Dean A.M. Shaw were prepared and presented to the Association.

An additional \$1350 in bonds from the life membership account were purchased. Ernie McKenzie suggested that a Who's Who in ag grads be printed (a listing of all grads). This idea was dropped because of the excessive cost of such a publication.

The Association agreed to award only one entrance scholarship valued at \$75 because of lack of interest in applying for the scholarship. The first report of the SAGA paying a portion (1/8) of the cost of Farm and Home Week program appeared in 1950.

1951

One hundred members attended the 16th annual meeting, January 9, 1951, in the Auditorium in Kirk Hall. The seventh annual bonspiel which attracted 28 rinks was held January 6 and 7. The total cost of ice was \$168. The twelfth lecture series was held on January 8 and 9 with the banquet and dance held on the evening of the 9th. Bond interest was at three

and four percent. The grads of 1923-24 were honoured at the banquet. The Association continued to make contributions to the Memorial Union Building fund. **The SAGA entrance scholarship was discontinued in 1951** because of the lack of interest, only one application was received.

The annual meeting voted to award \$50 to the top aggregate winner in the annual College and School Field Day. The winner in 1951 was R.E. Brack.

There was considerable discussion as to the need to change the English course offered to College of Agriculture students. The Association also expressed strong criticism of the curriculum of the School of Agriculture.

1952

The ag grad reunion, annual meeting and lecture series in 1952 continued for five days from January 5 to 9, with curling on Friday and Saturday, January 5 and 6, tea on Sunday, January 7 and the lecture series and annual meeting Monday, January 8 and Tuesday, January 9. Thirty-five rinks competed in the bonspiel, a substantial increase from the eight which competed in the first bonspiel. The grads of 1925-26 were honoured at the 1952 reunion activities.

The ag grads entered a float at the University of Saskatchewan alumni homecoming parade in the fall. The float, mounted on a flat bottom trailer consisted of a huge globe of the world, done in agro colours, and a life sized model of a Clydesdale horse that weighed two ton. The horse was hitched to the world. Everything went fine during the parade, but to place the model of the horse back to its rightful resting place above the entrance to the Livestock Pavilion was another story. One of the block and tackles being used broke, the model crashed to the floor, and no Clydesdale horse before or after has ever looked so completely destroyed. However, it was reassembled and has remained in the pavilion to collect dust and observe student behavior, but never again to take part in an alumni parade. This fine specimen which the T. Eaton Co. had used in a summer parade was a gift to the Department of Animal Husbandry.

A lecture series booklet of all presentations at Farm and Home Week was printed in 1952. Participating agencies contributed to the cost of printing the publication. It was at this time also that the ag grads took responsibility for the preparation of a booklet containing all presentations at Farm and Home Week.

John G. Rayner, Director of the Extension Department and a great supporter of ag grads died in 1952. John Rayner, although a Manitoba grad, served on many committees of the SAGA. Jack Pringle audited the Association books in place of Dean Thompson of Commerce who had been the Association auditor since its formation.

1953

The 18th annual meeting was held in the new gym on January 13, 1953. History records that 1953 was the beginning of the A.A. "Spike" Smith era. There were 40 rinks entered in the bonspiel, the largest entry to date. **The first Smoker was held at the Sergeant's Mess, Exhibition Grounds.** The cost of banquet and dance tickets remained at the low price of \$3 yet there were those who stayed home because of the high cost of the ticket.

The first agro student show was held in the fall of 1953 with the SAGA involved in publicity for the show. The records of the Association were lodged in the ASA lounge area in the Field Husbandry Building.

1954

The location of the 19th annual meeting, held January 12, 1954, was the Greystone Theatre. Ninety-one grads were in attendance. However 191 attended the ag grad lecture series.

The Sunday tea held January 11 had an excellent turn out. The graduates of 1929 and 1930 were honoured at the 1954 reunion activities. The ag grad Bonspiel continued to grow. A total of 44 rinks competed for the trophies and crests.

A new publication "Agricultural Science", to be published quarterly by the Extension Department, received endorsement by the Association. The Association purchased 1000 copies of the publication at 25¢ per copy per year for distribution to the membership.

The Association was concerned about the need for more students in the college and the university as a whole. A publicity campaign was undertaken by the Association in 1954 to enrol more students in the College of Agriculture. **The first suggestion of honoring those who graduated 20 years previously was put forth at executive meetings in 1954.**

An interesting discussion took place at an executive meeting regarding the location and cost of the annual banquet and dance. The executive agreed that they did not want to move the banquet and dance from the banquet room to the ballroom at the Bessborough because there was no assurance that high class music in the ballroom was available. Apparently, the superior **Kenny Peaker band** had a stronger affinity for the more aristocratic banquet room.

An item of the 1954 minutes refers to the fact that the ag grads refused to pay the composers, authors, and Publishing Association of Canada Ltd. a fee for music played by Kenny Peaker. Rupert Ramsay, Director of Extension Department and Bill Miner of ASA stated that they had not responded to a similar request. It is interesting to note that the same Canadian Group are still asking for this fee each year.

The ag grads were busy in 1954 collecting money from farmers who had indicated they would give wheat or equivalent dollars to the Memorial Union Building fund.

For the first and only time the Tommy Fraser Memorial award was presented jointly to a student in the College and School. There was a recommendation, however that an award similar to the Tommy Fraser be obtained for the School of Agriculture.

The Association executive drew to the attention of the membership that there were vacancies occurring in the Senate and that the SAGA should nominate strong candidates to contest these vacancies.

The Association representative to the Advisory Council of the College of Agriculture reported that a new swine barn was being contemplated and that a new class in public speaking, which was recommended by the SAGA, has been included in the curriculum of the college.

The first discussion of a Western College of Veterinary Medicine on the campus occurred at a meeting of the Advisory Council to the College of Agriculture. The SAGA had strongly recommended that a Veterinary College be established on the campus.

There was a suggestion that a herd of Hereford cattle be established on campus. The Advisory Council to the College of Agriculture recommended that "it is better to build one good herd of Shorthorns rather than a number of herds of lesser quality". It is interesting to note that even the Shorthorn herd is now non existent on the campus.

The executive agreed that a **veterans event in curling should be held in 1955** and that four sides of bacon donated by Intercontinental Packers Ltd. be given to the winners. The interest rates on money invested from the life membership account were 2 1/2 – 3 1/4 percent.

1955

The 20th annual meeting and 15th lecture series was held January 11, 1955 in the Auditorium of Kirk Hall. The Association obtained a box number at the University Post Office at a rental of \$1.50 per year. The University Hospital, the Memorial Union Building and the Murray Memorial Library were officially opened in 1955.

There was a heated debate on the suggestion of dropping the word "**College**" from the name of the Association. The "ayes" finally won out and the word "College" was dropped from the name. A total of 48 rinks competed in the bonspiel, only one team was entered in the veterans event. They did not receive the sides of bacon because there was no competition. No record is available as to what happened to the bacon. The winner of the Annual Field Day was to receive \$25 and a life membership in the Association.

The Association, in co-operation with the Regina Branch of the SIA entered a float in the Provincial Exhibition parade in Regina, the cost to the Association was \$17. This was a promotional activity for the SAGA and SIA. There was a general feeling that the money used for the float could be used more wisely on another project.

There was considerable discussion in 1955 on the rules and regulations for the bonspiel. The whole question centered around whether or not non-grads could curl and if eligible, the position they could play. Definite rules are to be drawn up for the 1956 bonspiel.

The 1955 graduating class in the School of Agriculture donated a trophy for a sportsmanship award, comparable to the Tommy Fraser award in the College, to the graduating class in the School of Agriculture. The first recipient was G.D. Donald.

1956

The 21st annual meeting and sixteenth lecture series was held January 9 and 10, 1956 in Convocation Hall and the auditorium in Kirk Hall. Forty-six rinks competed for the Kirk, Rutherford and Skelly trophies – a veterans' event was not held in 1956.

The Sunday tea was held in the Memorial Union Building, with the graduating class of 1936 of the College and School of Agriculture being honoured. There was a motion in 1956 that six newsletters be published annually. It never happened.

The ag grad ring made its first appearance in 1956. Six agricultural colleges across Canada had accepted the ring as a symbol of graduating from an agricul-

tural college. Dr. John Mitchell, Head, Department of Soil Science and the first President of the Association, died in 1956. John Mitchell had been a strong motivating force in the growth of the Association, and the development of the college was foremost in his mind at all times.

The representative of the Association on the Farm and Home Week planning committee reported that delegates to the meetings would no longer receive special excursion rates on the railways, since this subsidy was being discontinued. It was in 1956 that more formal steps were taken to have two representatives, the President and the Secretary from each participating organization on the Farm and Home Week planning committee.

An interesting debate and discussion at many annual meetings centered around the Association's budget. There were those who continually wanted to spend the money that was in the life membership account and the executive wanted the money invested to pay for servicing those members. The sentiment expressed was that the Association use some of the money to honor distinguished agriculturists by hanging their portraits in buildings or erecting plaques to signify their contributions to agriculture, the university and the province.

The ASA reported to the ag grads that in 1956 they had received lounge space on the top floor of the Field Husbandry Building. The Ag Grad Association gave the students authority to have a money raising project during the 1957 Reunion activities.

1957

Variety must be the spice of life as the 22nd annual meeting and seventeenth lecture series was held in Convocation Hall, the fifth different location in the past seven years. The annual meeting discussed at length, the role of the news editor and how the membership could assist the news editor in gathering of information and mailing of same. It was reported that the John Mitchell Memorial Fund had reached \$4724, however, more contributions were required.

The investment fund from the life membership account had reached \$2550, quite a contrast to a revenue of \$109.50 in 1935, the first year of the Association. There was considerable pressure by the membership to have buildings on the campus named after John Mitchell, John G. Rayner and Evan A. Hardy.

The executive suggested that the class of **each ten year period** since graduation be recognized and that the class of the 20 year period since graduation be the honor year. **The grads of 1938 would be honored in 1958, and at the same time grads of 1948, 1938, 1928 and 1918 would be recognized.**

The Association was particularly concerned about the low enrollment in the School of Agriculture, and it was recommended that greater effort be directed toward the recruitment of students.

There was considerable discussion about the problems encountered with agricultural graduates specializing in agricultural mechanics since they are discriminated against when applying for engineering jobs.

A detailed study of the cost of servicing the membership showed that it requires 70¢ - 80¢ per member annually. The revenue from life membership investment is not sufficient to provide services for the life membership. The new schedule for life membership fees would start at \$30 rather than \$20 with a credit of one-half for annual fees paid to date.

The Association was concerned about the liaison between graduates and the student bodies of the School of Agriculture and the College of Agriculture. There was a feeling that there should be a closer relationship between the student bodies and the ag grads.

1958

The 23rd annual meeting and lecture series was held on January 13 and 14, 1958 in Convocation Hall. The bonspiel held on January 10 and 11, had an entry of 40 rinks, the Smoker on Saturday night attracted 85 curlers, and the tea on Sunday drew a good crowd. A fun fest was held Monday evening in Kirk Hall and with the banquet and dance Tuesday night, January 14, at the Bessborough, the ag grads were provided with five very busy days of reunion activities.

The Mitchell Memorial Fund reached \$4840.56, and is earning six percent interest. The SAGA agreed to assist the ASA in furnishing the lounge, top floor, Field Husbandry Building. Money from the "problem patch" column in *The Western Producer* would also help pay for furnishings. The first discussion on preparing a plaque containing a list of the names of honor life members and a composite picture of all past presidents occurred in 1958. **Federated Co-operatives agreed to stand the cost of printing a list of graduates** for distribution to the members. Dr. K.W. Neatby, a long time friend and worker for the SAGA died in 1958. Dr. Neatby was a banquet speaker in 1942, had been an ardent supporter of the Association and particularly the College of Agriculture at the University of Saskatchewan.

1959

Convocation Hall was the location for the 24th annual meeting and nineteenth annual lecture series on January 12 and 13, 1959. Forty-six rinks, an unprecedented number, entered the bonspiel, and a record crowd, 149, attended the Smoker held at Intercontinental Packers on Friday night rather than Saturday night as in previous years. **Lynn Thompson, Wolseley, received the first John Mitchell Memorial Scholarship.**

Reference was made again to the fact that if agros are to have an influence in university government that the SAGA must nominate strong candidates to vacant positions on the university senate.

A very interesting discussion was initiated by the Saskatchewan Institute of Agrologists who asked the SAGA to relinquish its position on the Advisory Council to the College of Agriculture to the SIA claiming that a professional organization rather than a fraternal organization could more effectively represent agricultural interests. The SAGA agreed not to give up its position and wished SIA success in obtaining representation on the Advisory Council.

A special project of the SAGA to celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of the Province of Saskatchewan was the printing of a graduation booklet. The project was financed by Federated Co-operatives and spear-headed by E.W. McKenzie. Special reference was

made each year on the important role performed by the editor of the newsletter. The newsletter which was initiated the first year of the Association, has continued ever since, to be distributed three or four times annually. The newsletter is the most effective liaison the Association has with the membership.

1960

The Association reached a milestone in 1960, having completed 25 years of service. The 25th annual meeting, January 11 and 12, 1960 was held in connection with the twenty-eighth annual Farm and Home Week. **All 1959 graduates of the College and School of Agriculture joined the Association, a 100 percent sign up.** There were 44 rinks entered in the Ag Grad Bonspiel which was held at the city curling rinks. The Smoker was attended by 173 curlers and friends, the largest number to date and a profit of \$227.50, a rare occurrence, was made on this event.

The Association asked the university administration to name the School of Agriculture Building "Kirk Hall". There was further discussion in 1960 on the possibility of a Western College of Veterinary Medicine on the campus. The SAGA had repeatedly supported the need of a Veterinary College in Western Canada on the campus of the University of Saskatchewan. The executive developed plans in 1960 to hold a veteran's curling event in **1961 for curlers 48 years and over.**

1961

The 26th annual meeting and twenty-first-lecture series was held in Convocation Hall and the auditorium of Kirk Hall on January 9 and 10, 1961. Membership in the Association had remained constant, around the 800 mark, for the past ten years in spite of efforts for improvement. The reunion events continue to bring many grads to the campus and Saskatoon. The executive were concerned that grads who attended the curling events do not stay for reunion activities and the lecture series on Monday and Tuesday.

It was reported that the School of Agriculture Building had been renamed Kirk Hall. The executive agreed to obtain **photographs of all past presidents** and to have

them suitably mounted and hung in the hallway of the John Mitchell Building. The Agricultural Students' Association held their Agro Show in 1961.

1962

The 27th annual meeting and twenty-second lecture series was held on January 8 and 9, 1962, in Convocation Hall and the auditorium in Kirk Hall. A special drive to raise the membership to 900 or better was successfully undertaken in 1962. The entries in the bonspiel were down to 38 rinks, however 143 attended the Smoker held at Intercontinental Packers Ltd.

Plaques for the John Mitchell Building and Kirk Hall were obtained by the Association. These plaques were placed in suitable locations during special commemorative services. There was agreement that the photographs of the past presidents and the honorary life membership plaque would be hung in the John Mitchell Building.

1963

The 28th annual meeting held on January 7 and 8, 1963, had good news for the Association. **The membership, for the first time in the history of the Association, went over the 1000 mark.** The registrar reported 58 honorary life members, 702 annual members and 248 life members. The Smoker was attended by 189 members and friends and the Sunday Tea had 233 guests. A record number of 289 attended the annual banquet and dance at the Bessborough.

Miss Bernice McGrath, secretary to the Dean of Agriculture had married and planned to move to Vancouver. SAGA gave her a special citation and life membership to acknowledge her friendship and support of ag grads.

Evan Hardy of Agricultural Engineering and Manley Champlin of Field Husbandry, two pioneering professors, died in 1963. The association decided to make a strong effort to get faculty out to reunion activities. Their participation in recent years had been disappointing.

1964

The 29th annual meeting was held on January 13 and 14, 1964. A record 52 rinks entered the bonspiel and for the first time, the Sunday Tea was held in the Memorial Union Building. The Smoker was held at Intercontinental Packers. Consideration was given to moving the banquet and dance to Tuesday evening and having a bar at the event. Bonds, certificates and securities purchased from the membership account totalled \$4050.

The ag grads over the years have had quite an involvement in Farm and Home Week, and particularly the printing of the proceedings. The Association performed an editorial role and also assisted with sponsorship of advertisements in the proceedings.

The SAGA made representation to the University of Saskatchewan requesting the Agricultural Engineering Laboratory be renamed the Hardy Laboratory in recognition of Professor Evan A. Hardy. The new ROP station for the testing of purebred beef bulls was officially opened in 1964.

1965

The 30th annual meeting and twenty-sixth Ag Grad Lecture Series was held on January 11 and 12, 1965 and served as an official inaugural for the Celebrate Saskatchewan's 60th Anniversary as a Province. The Annual Reunion honored the 1945 graduates,

and also those who were enrolled in the Class of 1912 and graduated in 1915. The Classes of 1955, 1935 and 1925 were also recognized at the reunion activities.

A study of the ag grad membership undertaken in 1965 indicated that 18 percent lived in Saskatoon, 80 percent stayed in Saskatchewan and three percent lived outside of Saskatchewan. The study also revealed that 23 percent of the total membership graduated in the five year period 1960 - 1964.

The annual meeting suggested that better facilities than Convocation Hall should be obtained on the university campus for Farm and Home Week meetings. Because of the drop in enrolment in the College of Agriculture, the Association agreed to do all in its power to assist in encouraging more students to enrol.

Dean Les Hutcheon died suddenly while at work in 1965. A group of grads suggested that a trophy as a memorial to Les Hutcheon be obtained for the veterans' curling event.

1966

The annual meeting held on January 10, 1966, received a report that 600 annual members were at least one year in arrears in payment of fees. The Association membership was down to 846. An attractively designed certificate, properly lettered and signed was mailed to all former recipients of the Tommy Fraser award. As a result of an energetic campaign, 123 grads took life memberships which provided an income of \$3075.

The three immediate past presidents of the Association were appointed as the nominating committee for officers and honorary life memberships. The tickets for the banquet and dance were raised to \$4.25, but only after considerable debate. The Association undertook to defray the costs of having former Dean Rutherford installed in the Agricultural Hall of Fame, Royal Winter Fair in Toronto. The minutes of the annual meeting refer to a letter written to the executive from Mike Kindrachuk, president of the University Alumni, thanking and congratulating the Ag Grad Association on its service to the province and the University of Saskatchewan.

1967

The 32nd annual meeting and twenty-eighth lecture series was held on January 9 and 10, 1967. Because of Canada's centennial celebration, a special lecture series was arranged. Internationally known speakers, Dr. G.A. Hissocks, Dr. M.W. Menzies and Mr. A.G. Leeks, were on the program.

Steps were taken in 1967 to establish a new **system using the computer** for recording of memberships and the preparation of address labels for mailing newsletters.

The life membership number increased to 346 during the past year, producing a life membership income of \$3879.46. The Association handled \$3470.71 in the regular account during the past year, an indication of the amount of business conducted. There was a strong recommendation in 1967 that the bonspiel entry be increased to 64 rinks in the regular events. There was also agreement that 10, 30, 40, 50 reunion and 20 year **honor ribbons** be printed for distribution at the time of the reunion activities.

1968

The 33rd annual meeting and the twenty-ninth ag grad lecture series was held on January 8 and 9, 1968. Ladies' socials were held in the homes of ag. grads in the city. This was a first.

The registrar reported there were 510 annual and 523 life memberships paid up. This was the first time that the number of life memberships surpassed the annual memberships. Since the Association had \$8000 invested from life memberships, Ernie McKenzie suggested that the money could be spent to a much better purpose than just collecting interest.

The annual meeting received a report that enrolment was up in the first years of the college and the school. There were 147 in first year college and 125 in first year School of Agriculture. Both enrollments were the highest since the post war boom.

The College of Agriculture was pressing for a feed testing laboratory on the campus.

A record number of 242 attended the Friday night Smoker, 300 registered for the Monday night social, and a record 60 rinks were entered in the bonspiel to compete for four trophies, the Kirk, Rutherford, Graham and Skelly. Dr. L.E. Kirk, Honorary President in 1967-68 gave the address of welcome to the assembly. Dr. Kirk challenged the Association to write a history of its involvement in University of Saskatchewan Farm and Home Week. The grads of 1948 presented a new trophy for curling called the Graham Trophy. Eric Beveridge, representing the class of 1926, presented the Hutcheon trophy for the Veterans' curling event. During 1968, **for the first time, the Association held two reunions during the summer, one at the Research Station at Melfort and the other at the Ossie Dodge farm at Shellbrook.**

There was considerable discussion in 1968 as to the feasibility of a women's auxiliary of the Association. It is noteworthy to record that from 1965 to 1970 there was considerable student unrest on the campus. This was of concern to the ag grads. The executive agreed, in 1968, to use the computer in the preparation of the mailing list of Association members.

1969

The 34th annual meeting and thirtieth lecture series was held in Convocation Hall on January 13, 14, 1969. The annual meeting agreed to donate \$100 per year for the next six years to the University of Saskatchewan National Campaign for funds. Participation records were established at the 1969 reunion activities; 72 rinks competed in curling, 266 grads and friends attended the Smoker, 84 ladies attended the Smokette and 265 guests took in the Sunday Tea. The cost of the banquet and dance remained at \$5.

It was reported to the annual meeting that 1749 diplomas have been granted from the School of Agriculture since the start of the program. There was considerable discussion at the annual meeting about the problems between students and the University Board of Governors – students wanted more input into University operation and decision making. The Agricultural Students' Association asked the ag grads to assist them in discussions with the administration

about their concerns on the operation of residences, the bookstore and registration procedures.

The ag grads were asked to become involved in a study called the Future Role of the College, which was in progress. **The Feed Testing Laboratory became a reality in 1969.** Dr. L.E. Kirk, former Dean and strong supporter of the ag grad Association died. There was considerable discussion within the Association as to the name for the ladies social. The suggestion of "Hen Party" was not very popular. The idea of "Smokette" was quite well received.

1970

Convocation Hall was the location for the 35th annual meeting and thirty-first lecture series on January 12 and 13, 1970. The Sunday Tea was attended by 250, with 252 in attendance at the Smoker. For the first time, the annual banquet and dance was held on a Monday, the cost being \$5.50 per person.

The Van Vliet Memorial Fund stood at \$10,980 and was invested at 6 3/4 percent. The revenue from the fund was to provide a graduate scholarship in agricultural economics at a recognized University.

There was considerable debate at the annual meeting and during the executive meetings in 1970 as to who is eligible to curl in the bonspiel. The discussion centered around agricultural engineers. The grads of the 1950 class were honored and recognition given to the graduating classes of 1950, 1940, 1930 and 1920. Investments of the life membership account were yielding 8 3/4 and 9 percent interest.

A new schedule for life memberships was established in 1970 for ratification at the 1971 annual meeting of the Association.

1971

The 36th annual meeting and thirty-second annual lecture series was held in Convocation Hall on January 11, 1971. The Hadley Van Vliet Memorial Fund reached \$11,014.84. The fund was transferred to the University of Saskatchewan Controller for management purposes. **Glen W. Herndier was awarded the first Hadley Van Vliet Memorial Scholarship.**

Sixty rinks took part in the regular bonspiel events and seven rinks participated in the Hutcheon event. The life membership account has \$9,000 invested in securities. There was an expression of dismay that the records of the Association were still in boxes in homes and offices. These historical records should be in the University Archives. There was a strong concern about the drop in enrolment in the first year college program. The enrollment was the lowest in ten years, however, the School of Agriculture had an increase in enrollment.

The annual meeting was informed that the membership list was now on the computer and therefore the labels for mailing newsletters were computerized. A resolution was passed urging the Board of Governors of the university and the Government of Saskatchewan to provide more funds for scientific development.

A major revision of the constitution occurred at the 1971 annual meeting to provide for a new fee schedule for life memberships and to establish a new wording for the various member categories.

The Association was informed that the Department of Crop Science had prepared a brief to the Saskatchewan and Canada Departments of Agriculture on the need for a Crop Research Institute. The study on the Role of the College of Agriculture was still continuing.

The University of Saskatchewan Alumni agreed in 1971 to support the ag grads by printing the banquet program.

The first mention of a Saskatchewan Agricultural Hall of Fame appeared in 1971. The Association agreed to have a membership in the organization and **was a founding member of the Saskatchewan Agricultural Hall of Fame. A.G. "Bud" Smith** was named as the first representative from the ag. grads.

The Association executive agreed that the rigors of curling, the banquet and dance, the Smoker and Smokette, the Sunday Tea and other socials were taking their toll and therefore the annual meeting should start at 10:00 a.m. and not 8:30 or 9:00 am. A monumental decision.

Harold Moss, one of the early grads, received an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree from the University of Saskatchewan at the 1971 spring Convocation. **Dr. Moss has Number 1 life membership card in the SAGA.**

1972

Room 241, Arts Building was the location for the 37th annual meeting and lecture series held on January 10 and 11, 1972. The annual banquet and dance was held at the Centennial Auditorium. The price of a ticket was \$5.50 and 352 people attended. There were 58 rinks in the open events and 10 rinks in the Veterans' (Hutcheon) event.

The annual meeting in 1972 received a report from the representative to the Advisory Council that the Crop Development Centre was established and operating and that the College of Agriculture was twinned with the University of Makerere, Kampala, Uganda.

The annual meeting and the Association executive hotly contested the suggestion that a ladies program of curling be incorporated with the ag. grad curling with the result that the idea was shelved. The Agricultural Hall of Fame, located in the Western Development Museum was opened in 1972. **It was during this year that the historical material of the SAGA was placed in the University Archives, Murray Memorial Library.**

1973

The 38th annual meeting and thirty-fourth annual lecture series was held on January 8, 1973, in the Quance Lecture Theatre, Education Building.

The **first** wine and cheese social, the **"Smokette"** was held in the upper lounge of the Exhibition curling rink for the ladies. A total of 251 attended the Smoker. The Sunday Tea for the first and only time, was held at the Western Development Museum,

because of the first inductions into Saskatchewan's Agricultural Hall of Fame. Fifty-eight rinks participated in the main curling events and 10 rinks were entered in the Hutcheon event.

A study of the ag grad membership showed that:

- 32 percent of the grads of the 70's hold a membership in the SAGA
- 49 percent of the grads of the 60's hold a membership in the SAGA
- 36 percent of the grads of the 50's hold a membership in the SAGA
- 44 percent of the grads of the 40's hold a membership in the SAGA

During 1973, the Association devoted considerable time trying to decide what to do with the **millstones** which were located behind the Livestock Pavilion. The millstones according to information received, were left to the University because of the important role early gristmills played in the settlement of Western Canada.

The University of Saskatchewan Alumni helped with the mailing of the December ag grads newsletter.

1974

The 39th annual meeting and thirty-fifth annual lecture series was held January 14 1974, in Room 241 Arts Building. The bonspiel had 60 rinks in the open events and eight rinks in the veterans' event. The Smoker and Smokette were well attended. The annual banquet and dance was held in the Centennial Auditorium.

There was a suggestion that the Association should place a plaque near Room 104, College Building (now Administration Building) where the first meeting of the Association was held.

There was much heated discussion at the annual meeting as the Association had been advised that it would **no longer** have **membership** on the **Advisory Council** to the College of Agriculture. A strong letter of protest was to be written to the Dean of Agriculture and Secretary of the Board of Governors

of the university expressing the Association's disapproval of the decision to discontinue the SAGA membership on the Advisory Council. The letter must have worked because we still have a seat on the Advisory Council.

The suggestion appeared during 1974 that the format for the ag grad annual meeting, lecture series, reunion and bonspiel should be changed to have the lecture series on Friday morning of Farm and Home Week followed by the annual meeting in the afternoon. Curling would start Friday afternoon, Smoker and Smokette Friday evening. Curling continue on Saturday and Sunday with the annual banquet and dance Saturday evening.

The ag grads held the first and only golf tournament to date at Swift Current on June 8, following the SIA annual meeting. The tournament coincided with Dean White's retirement.

The millstones were still looking for a home and the Association was still debating what to do with them.

1975

The 40th annual meeting and the thirty-sixth lecture series was held in Room 143 Arts Building. Tickets for the annual banquet and dance, held at the Sheraton Cavalier, were \$7.50 each and 496 were sold. The Sunday afternoon tea, held for the first time at the Sheraton Cavalier Hotel, was attended by 150 grads and friends. The program schedule for the ag

grads reunion activities, annual meeting and lecture series took the new format in 1975 with the lecture series and annual meeting held prior to curling and social events.

Historical events occurred during the fortieth annual meeting and reunion activities. The Hadley Van Vliet Memorial Library in Kirk Hall was officially dedicated with Pauline Van Vliet unveiling the plaque. It also marked 50 years since the founding of the Department of Agricultural Economics (formerly Farm Management).

Recognition of the founding meeting of the Association was also part of the reunion activities. Sol Sinclair, Howard McDonald and Harold Moss, three ag. grads who were in attendance at the first meeting, May, 1935, took part in the special ceremony. The 60-year reunion of the Class of 1915 also took place during the annual meeting and associated activities. The Association has \$12,000 invested in securities. What a difference forty years make!

Ernie McKenzie, long-time supporter and worker for the ag. grads, was killed in a car accident in Regina in 1975.

In 1975, the Association opened an account with the University of Saskatchewan, in order to facilitate the payment for printing and mailing of newsletters. A plaque was prepared to present to the recipient of the Tommy Fraser Award. All previous winners were also to receive a plaque.

The Association took steps in 1975 to consider obtaining portraits of all former deans which would be suitably framed and placed in the John Mitchell Building. The University Alumni office made a computer printout of all graduates of the College of Agriculture for the Association.

The millstone project was finally dropped. The Crop Science Department had them placed in front of the Crop Development Centre.

The Association was informed about the inadequacy of space for agricultural classes and laboratories being provided in the new Engineering Building. The Association wrote letters to the Dean of Engineering, Dean of Agriculture, President and Vice-President of the University, expressing our concern.

The Association prepared a set of guidelines or criteria in 1975 for use in selecting honorary life memberships.

1976

The 41st annual meeting and thirty-seventh lecture series was held on January 16, 1976, in the Quance Lecture Theatre, Education Building. The secretary-treasurer reported that over \$10,000 was handled during the past year. During 1976 the investment portfolio was brought up to \$15,000

Frank Payne, nephew of former Dean, L.E. Kirk, presented a portrait of Dr. Kirk to the Association. The largest crowd ever, 550, attended the annual banquet and dance at the Centennial Auditorium on January 17, 1976. A vigorous campaign was undertaken in 1976 to get more members. By April of 1976, the membership had grown to 1324. Of this total, 905 were life members. As a Memorial to the late E.W. McKenzie, an award was established to recognize a student in the College or School of Agriculture who demonstrated excellence in communication skills.

The Association were informed that the women don't give up easily. They still wish to have a joint Smoker-Smokette with the curlers. A special resolution was prepared to indicate in our constitution that the Association was a non-profit organization. It should be noted that the Association had Cosmopolitan Industries, a sheltered workshop for handicapped adults, assist with the mailing of the newsletter.

1977

The 42nd annual meeting and thirty-eighth annual lecture series was held on January 14, 1977 in the education building. A tradition which started early in the history of the Association, that of remembering those ag grads who had died since the last annual meeting, continues to be a part of every annual meeting. Fourteen ag grads were recognized in the memorial list.

The newsletters during the past year included several items on the College and the School of Agriculture program as well as a report on the status of the College of Agriculture. The annual meeting recom-

mended that the members-at-large be appointed reporters for the newsletter.

Article 13. Non-profit and dissolution was added to the constitution. The article stated: a) the Association shall conduct its affairs without the purpose of financial gain for its members and any profits or other accreditations to the Association shall be used in promoting its objectives. b) in the event of dissolution or winding up of the Association, all its remaining assets after payment of liabilities, shall be distributed to one or more recognized charitable organizations in Canada.

The annual meeting passed a resolution declaring the Association's support of the concept of a producer controlled check off on grains grown in the Canadian Wheat Board area for the purpose of production and marketing research and that the Association members assist in the educational program prior to the March plebiscite.

The membership was informed that a "space survey" study is underway in the College. The College of Agriculture needs, not only more space, but also additional staff.

1978

The 43rd annual meeting and thirty-ninth Ag Grad Lecture Series was held on January 13, 1978 in the Education Building. Special reference was made to the new look for the ag grad newsletter "THE SAGA" and its ready acceptance by the membership.

The Association gave particular support to the College of Agriculture request and the Saskatchewan Institute of Agrologists brief to the Government of Saskatchewan for additional space and staff. Concern of the Association on the need for additional facilities was also directed by our representative on the Advisory Council to the College of Agriculture.

Over \$18,000 in business transactions was handled by the Secretary-Treasurer, a fair difference when compared to the first year of operation when the audit report showed that about \$110 was transacted.

An energetic campaign for membership conducted in 1977 by mailing letters to 2200 ag grads who were not members and letters to members one year in arrears brought the membership to 1609. An all time record. The membership was made up with 49 honorary life, 1062 life and 498 annual members. The ag grad bonspiel had a full compliment of rinks, and the lecture series was attended by 150 graduates.

The meeting was informed that a new English class and a class in public speaking were introduced into the college curriculum. The student enrolment had increased during the past few years and the College of Agriculture, University of Saskatchewan had the highest student to faculty ratio of the four Western Colleges of Agriculture. The annual meeting gave support to the Saskatchewan Agricultural Youth Institute and instructed the executive to forward \$150 to aid the 1978 Institute program.

1979

The 44th annual meeting and the fortieth lecture series of the Association was held on January 12, 1979 in the Education Building. The Association had now obtained portraits of all deans of the College of Agriculture. A suitable location for hanging the portraits was to be determined. The president reported to the annual meeting that all archive material of the Association was now located with the University Archives.

The Association became involved in the controversy over the establishment of agricultural courses at the Wascana Technical Institute in Regina. The members present expressed concern that the program at Wascana would become a duplication of courses offered through the School of Agriculture. A committee of the Association met with some of the officials in Regina and letters expressing our concern were sent to cabinet ministers and Department of Education and Agriculture officials in Regina.

The membership approved continued support for the Saskatchewan Agricultural Youth Institute.

The annual membership fee was increased to \$4. A new fee schedule of life membership was approved at the annual meeting.

Two ag grads, D. R. Robinson and J. D. MacFarlane were inducted into Saskatchewan's Agricultural Hall of Fame. It is interesting to record that the financial report to the annual meeting showed receipts totaling \$22,626.34 and an investment of \$28,000 in the life membership account. The executive at a meeting on January 5, 1979, approved the idea of writing a history of the Association. The Class of 1949 collected \$2400 to establish a "49ers Visiting Lecture Fund" to be used to bring visiting lecturers to the students. The Vice-President of the ag grads was named to a committee to oversee the use of the fund. A full complement of 64 rinks entered the regular ag grad 'spiel and 18 rinks, an all time high, entered the Hutcheon event. The lecture series was well supported. A new record attendance of 835 attended the banquet and dance. This is in contrast to 46 who attended the first banquet. The Smoker registered 435, another all time high. The executive requested that steps be taken to encourage more undergrads to attend reunion activities as this would help to promote memberships in the Association. A decision was made in 1979 to combine the Smoker and Smokette into one function.

The Association was informed that Bill #346, which established the Agricultural Research Funding Act, was introduced into the Provincial Legislature in 1979. The Association had considerable discussion about the steps that should be taken in the search for a new President of the University of Saskatchewan. The Association agreed that it would not provide lists of members to other organizations.

1980

The 45th annual meeting and forty-first Ag Grad Lecture Series was held on January 18, 1980 in the Education Building.

There were 18 names on the memorial list including three former Presidents of the Association, L. Bell, O.R. Mooney and O.B. Young.

The Association received a \$3,000 grant from Celebrate Saskatchewan Committee toward the cost of publishing the history of the SAGA.

The fiscal year of the Association was changed from the calendar year January 1 to December 31 to November 1 to October 31 in order to accommodate the auditing of the books.

The membership was informed that the Shebeski report to the university questioned the ownership of agricultural farms by the College of Agriculture. A special committee was established to bring in a more detailed study on this aspect of the Shebeski report. Concern was expressed at the meeting that there are not sufficient numbers of grads taking post graduate work to meet the demand.

The grad curling had a full slate of 64 rinks with an additional 18 rinks in the Hutcheon event. The first joint Smoker was held in the Wheatlands Building, exhibition grounds, and was attended by 536 people. The ladies, after many years of urging, finally won their battle. The number of honour year members returning for their reunions continues to grow, with 380 reunion year members and spouses in attendance.

The annual banquet and dance held at the Centennial Auditorium cost \$10 per person. At one time the grads were asked to keep the 1936 banquet price at 50¢ per person.

The ag grads submitted the name of Ross Greenshields as a candidate for Chancellor of the University. (Note: Ross was not elected but he gave it a good try.)

1981

The annual meeting held during the 49th Farm and Home Week was called to order in room 1004 Education Building on January 16 with 50 members in attendance. Preceding the meeting was the lecture series "Chemicals on the Farm" which featured a panel composed of Dr. H.B. Schiefer, WCVM, Dr R. Ashford, Crop Science, a representative of Canadian

Agricultural Chemical Association and farmer Bill Heenan Grand Coulee Sask.

The meeting recognized 13 grads that passed away during the past year.

Since the last annual meeting the Historical Review & Register of Graduates book was produced by Herb Clark, Art Stilborn, Bob McKercher and Les Henry. 1000 copies were printed. The project was supported by a grant of \$3000 from Sask. 75th Anniversary program. The research in preparing the history book revealed that SAGA had never been registered provincially. An application was being prepared to register SAGA as a no-profit organization. Auditor Wilkinson reported total assets of \$40,694.

A decision was made to use some of the College Class of '49 fund to bring in Dr. Grant MacEwan to open Agriview, to make an application to U of S Senate to admit School grads and to nominate R. Greenshields for Chancellor. The College would be officially contacted to make it known that SAGA wished to participate in the review of the School of Agriculture and struck a committee of B. Blakely, B. Backman and E. Bendig.

The Smoker was held at Wheatland A with 591 in attendance and the banquet and dance at the Centennial Auditorium with 700 participating.

1982

The 47th Annual meeting was called to order at 1:30 pm January 15, 1982 in room 1004 Education Building with 50 in attendance. The 43rd annual lecture series topic was "Energy Policies and Agriculture".

Auditor Wilkinson reported total assets of \$41,072. Annual membership fees were set at \$6, \$50 for grads of more than 10 years and \$60 for 10 years or less. It was noted that membership had changed to mainly life from annual and this has an effect on funding the newsletter. A decision was made to do three rather than four newsletters.

The incorporation process was underway but not yet completed. The SAGA School Review Committee

presented its report to the University Vice President and School grads had been extended Convocation privileges.

A resolution noting the 50th Annual Farm and Home Week was passed and sent to the planning committee of the new Ag Building urging the incorporating of facilities to accommodate meetings and extension activities such as Farm and Home Week.

Stu Harrison was recognized on his 50th anniversary of graduation for his work in framing life membership certificates.

The Smoker was again held at Wheatland A and banquet and dance at Centennial Auditorium.

During the year the executive discussed changing the name of the Smoker. It was also brought to the executives attention that the university was considering moving Farm and Home Week to mid-term break in February and concern for this proposal was expressed.

1983

The 48th SAGA annual meeting was called to order at 11:30am January 14, immediately following the lecture series with 225 in attendance. Topic of the 44th lecture series was "Agriculture Education: Responding to the Times". The annual meeting was held directly after the lecture series to encourage a larger attendance. The meeting continued after lunch in 1004 Education Building with 48 in attendance.

The October 31, 1982 SAGA assets were \$44,468. It was reported the new Ag. Building was second to Geology which was at the top of the University construction list. During the past year incorporation of SAGA as a non-profit organization was completed. The pros and cons of moving Farm and Home Week to mid February were outlined. There would be a problem with ice availability for curling and possibly hotel rooms but meeting room availability at U of S would be better. Consensus of the meeting was not to change Farm and Home Week date.

A committee, including SVAA President was set up to review the proposed changes to the School curriculum.

Dean Jake Brown reported that a large lecture theatre would not likely be part of a new Ag. Building. A motion was passed for SAGA to work with other concerned groups to develop an Agriculture Building Fund. The following resolution was passed, "that SAGA press for the concept of a new Ag. Building rather than renovations and addition to existing buildings and that the building have public access and include an area for meetings, extension activities and continuing education activities".

The Smoker had 620 attendees and the banquet and dance 825.

1984

The 49th annual meeting was called to order at 11:30 am January 13 in Room 1004 Education Building with 150 in attendance. It followed the lecture series entitled "Water Use in Agriculture and Non-Agriculture" with speakers Red Williams, Jon Gillies and MLA Jerry Muirhead. After lunch break the meeting reconvened at 1:00pm with 82 attending.

Dean Jake Brown reported that with the diploma program change to three years the maximum first year enrollment reduced to 120 (from 170) and those with less than a full grade 12 were encouraged to finish high school before making application.

After considerable discussion a decision was made for SAGA to work with SIA and other interested organizations to support a major fund raising program for a new Ag. Building. The Ross Greenshields idea of a "Sodbusters Club" of which 100 contributors of \$1000 would be used to do a feasibility study for a new Ag Building was supported by resolution.

Total assets of \$45,599 were reported by auditor Wilkinson. Annual membership was raised to \$8, life \$70 for those 10 years past graduation and \$80 for others. The Smoker again was at Wheatland A and with 500 expected to attend reunion year activities 750 were expected for the banquet and dance at Centennial Auditorium.

1985

The 50th annual meeting and 46th lecture series were held on January 11, in the Education Building. Managing Farm Finances was the lecture topic with H. Matilla, T. Mann, B. Wiese and R. Thorstad as speakers.

There were 325 expected for the reunion years with smoker at Wheatland A and banquet and dance at the Centennial Auditorium. Tickets for banquet and dance were \$17.50. Special mention was made of the Pontus Wicklund class of '15 for their 70th anniversary of graduation. There was a full slate of 64 curling teams in the regular event and 10 in the Hutcheon (seniors) event. Curling cost was \$14 per person.

The Sodbusters club had exceeded its objective and Lin Boyes announced his retirement as newsletter editor but was persuaded to change his mind. There was considerable discussion about the interest on investments from life memberships not being sufficient to fund the newsletter which cost \$6.85 per member plus secretarial services. Some grads in attendance chided others for living too long and suggested volunteer donations for those who graduated a long time ago. It was agreed to wait and see how finances fared with the new fee structure approved at last years meeting.

1986

There was a full slate of 64 regular rinks, 12 senior and 6 in the mixed event for the 51st reunion. Past Dean Jake Brown donated a trophy for the mixed event. The Smoker moved to Western Development Museum, needed 350 to break even at \$6 per head. The banquet and dance was set for 750 at the Centennial Auditorium at a cost of \$20 per person. SAGA assets were listed at \$51,755.

The 47th lecture started at 8:30am January 27 U of S Education Building. Speakers on the topic "Free Trade in the Agricultural Industry" were Dr. B. Lucas, STM, and Drs G. Lee and G. Storey. Between 300 and 400 people attended. The 51st annual meeting was called to order at 1:00pm 1004 Education Building. There

was lots of discussion about SAGA finances and it was suggested that reunion activities should budget for a small surplus rather than break even. A lack of activity on the new Ag. Building was noted. SAGA members will be involved in an Agricultural Extension Review by presenting a brief and in the 75th Anniversary of the College.

During the past year the executive worked on a new logo which was presented to and adopted at the annual meeting. A motion was passed to change the name from Smoker to Mixer. A resolution of recognizing for Sodbusters Club was passed as well as a resolution calling for a 500 seat theatre in the new Ag Building to accommodate Farm and Home Week activities.

Past presidents organized a July 6th luncheon to look at a fund to furnish a SAGA office if the new building should go ahead. The October executive meeting discussed and recommended that an Ag. Business, Sales and Marketing option be added to the College curriculum.

1987

The January 16 lecture series topic of "Managing Saskatchewan Water" featured speakers from Science Council of Canada, Sask. Water Corp., Eric Jensen an engineer from Olds, AB and Eric Farden a farmer from Macrorie Sask.

The 52nd annual meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm at 1004 Education Building. The reunion activities were expected to involve 220 grads. Pins and hats with the new logo were available for sale at \$3 and \$5 respectively. Independent Annuity and Insurance Services was selected to manage the investments. A motion to raise the annual membership to \$10 was passed. It was noted the Livestock Pavilion had been torn down and Herb Clark had taken pictures and would write a history of the building. The need for an Ag. Business, Sales and Marketing option was discussed and SAGA recommended the College look into adding that option.

It was reported the new building announced last spring did not contain facilities to accommodate

Farm and Home Week and there was the possibility of some space for SAGA. The annual meeting passed a resolution expressing the need for a 500 seat theatre in the new building.

The Smoker held at Marquis Hall had an attendance of 535 and produced a surplus of \$916 with a \$6 fee. The banquet and dance at the Centennial Auditorium was also a financial success producing a \$1,898 profit. There were 58 regular and 10 Hutcheon teams competing for the trophies. Mixed curling was dropped due to lack of interest.

SAGA supported the plans to raise \$12 million for the new building. The province would be divided into 12 to 14 areas for canvassing purposes. Bob Brack was named to be the SAGA fund raising representative.

The first class of the new three year School program graduated in 1987.

1988

The January 8 executive meeting was the first time a hockey tournament was mentioned. It was one of several items on the questionnaire mailed out to seek membership views.

The 49th lecture series "Farmers in Politics" preceded the 53rd annual meeting in 1004 Education Building. The meeting passed a motion of support to a move of Farm and Home Week to February. It was noted any such move would not take place till 1990 to allow the several organizations involved sufficient lead time. Total assets at fiscal year end was \$60,018. It was reported that there would not be an Ag. Business option added to the College curriculum and a total of \$5 million had been pledged to the building fund and alumni donations at \$375,000 was ahead of schedule.

There was discussion about the increasing cost of the news letter/postage which went from \$8,962 in 1995 to \$12,435 in 1997. It was noted a letter on file indicated SAGA was exempt from GST and PST rules also exempted SAGA. A motion was passed to produce four news letters per year and limit each edition to twelve pages.

March 25, 1988 SAGA executive meeting discussed making representation to SIA about recognition for School grads, possibly as a technician and planning for an 8 team hockey tournament started. Both ASA and SVAA representatives attended the meeting. Work was started on a new brochure. College of Home Economics requested SAGA advertise their reunion in the newsletter.

Sod turning for the new Ag Building took place Nov 11, 1988.

1989

January 13 was the date of the 50th Lecture series which addressed the topic "Biotechnology". Presenters were G. Lee, B Rossnagel and B. Laarveld U of S, G. Wells Biotechnia Canada Inc. and M. Bryck SWP. The attendance was disappointing. The 54h annual meeting followed at 100 Arts Building. Mention was made that both University President Kristjanson and College of Agriculture Dean Rennie would retire this year.

The fundraising for the Ag. Building had exceeded it's target and fiscal year end SAGA assets stood at \$57,766. Two thousand of the new brochures had been printed and it was decided to send it to all grads of the last five years to encourage membership purchase. The College of Agriculture Advisory Committee at their last meeting passed a motion urging Ag. Econ. to create a class in agriculture marketing.

Glen Hass had been elected Vice President U of S Alumni Association. The SAGA annual meeting passed a motion to amend the constitution to include election of a representative to the Alumni Association and a resolution asking the Alumni Association to revise their constitution to allow each college to appoint their own representative to the association.

The first hockey tournament included ten teams of 16 players. The championship trophy was donated by Don Rennie. The tournament showed a small profit. The Mixer at Marquis Hall was attended by 638 and had a profit of \$1,132. The 606 that attended the banquet and dance was below the guarantee and lost \$852. The bonspiel had 43 regular and 18 Hutcheon rinks.

At the February 10 executive meeting a motion was passed to support the proposal to not change Farm and Home Week to February. There had been discussion by Farm and Home Week planners about moving off campus and alternating between Regina and Saskatoon. At the March 20 meeting it was reported there would be no move to February with January 8-12 the dates for 1990.

1990

Topic of the 51st lecture series January 12, 1990 was "Pesticides, Friend or Foe" with speakers from Crop Protection Institute, Organic Producers Co-op and Philom Bios. The annual meeting followed with 41 in attendance in room 165 Physics. SAGA membership for the first time surpassed 2000. October year end audited by Doug Wilkinson showed assets of \$57,806 and the investment guideline was 20% long term, 30% short term and 50% intermediate term assets.

The meeting heard concern about the high drop out/failure rate of 45%. An off-campus certificate program in crop production, livestock production and farm management was in the development stage.

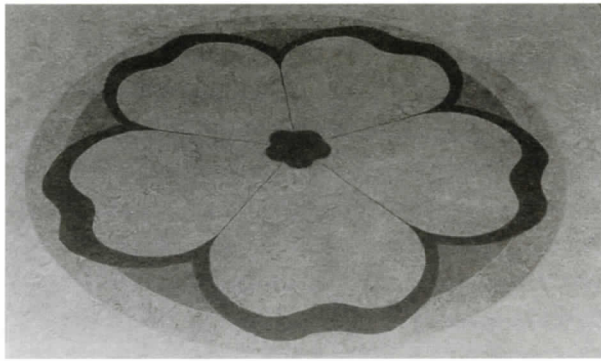
A resolution to the University President and Extension Division provided support for retention of Farm and Home Week at the University and that Quance Theatre be made available.

The hockey tournament had 12 teams, there was a full slate of 32 regular curling teams and 16 in the seniors. Admission price of the Mixer was \$7 and the banquet and dance had a guarantee of 600 with ticket price raised to \$25.

In September 1990 it was reported that the Partners in Progress public fundraising program for the agriculture building had exceeded the \$12 million goal by \$800,000.

1991

The 56th annual meeting and 52nd lecture series took place January 11 in room 129 Thorvaldson. The Lecture topic was "The story of GRIP and NISA" with 100 in attendance. The banquet and dance guaran-

tee at the Centennial Auditorium was set at 525. The Friday evening Mixer was at Marquis Hall. The meeting suggested the executive look for another venue where parking was easier. There was also discussion about some names missing from the list of graduates and the history book should be used in making the reunion list. There were 10 teams registered for hockey.

The meeting discussed a proposal to replace the lecture series with an ag grad event that involved both students and grads. To do this it was necessary to stay with a January date since students were not there during the February break. Events would start Friday morning and need the co-operation of the College and student associations. There was support expressed by the college but concern for students missing classes in other colleges was a factor. There could be difficulty finding a room or facilities on campus for a group this size.

Commodity groups are meeting at the normal January time at a location off campus. They would plan their Friday activities so as to not interfere with SAGA Friday evening Mixer.

It was reported the Past Presidents Club that started in 1986 with donations of \$100 each from former Presidents had accumulated \$2100 and this was going to be used to purchase a bookcase for the SAGA office in the new building.

SAGA Oct 31, 1990 assets at \$58,835 were confirmed by auditor Wilkinson and after much discussion a motion was passed to leave the decision on investments to the executive.

1992

This was a year of lots of changes. The lecture series ended in 1991 and was replaced by Friday morning activities (Ag. Discovery Day) involving students. The Tractor Lab was made available for this event. In support for this, classes for both School and College students were canceled. The 57th annual meeting followed at 1:30 pm in 2E25 Agriculture. There were 32 regular curling teams and 11 in the Hutcheon event. Eleven hockey teams participated. The Mixer moved to Saskatoon Inn where the several organizations held meetings which formerly held their meetings at Quance Theatre. The banquet and dance continued at the Centennial Auditorium with ticket price increased to \$30. To encourage students to participate there were dance only tickets sold at \$5.

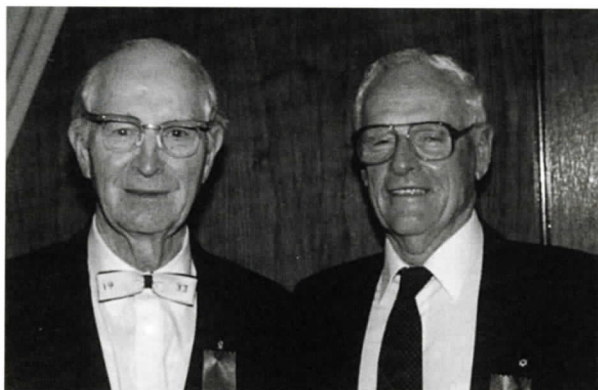
Finances of the association were still a concern and the \$6.40 earned per \$80 life membership was below the annual cost of servicing a member. A motion was passed to ask life members to send in an annual membership fee to help out.

Newsletter editor Jack Braidek reported that he would get the membership list on disk to make newsletter distribution easier. He was thanked for taking over the editor job on such short notice.

The University was going to host a new Farm and Home Week in February.

1993

The 58th Annual meeting was held January 15 in room 144 Kirk Hall. The meeting was preceded by Ag. Discovery and again the college canceled classes to allow students and faculty to participate. 1993 saw another change with the banquet and dance moving to the Sheraton Cavalier Hotel. In doing this the full ticket could be reduced to \$25 and dance only tickets at \$10 for members and \$5 for ag. students. Newsletter Editor, Jack Braidek, explored a new postal rate that allowed a larger 50 gram letter to be sent without an envelope at 32¢ compared to the previous 32 gram letter that required an envelope at a higher postal rate, saving about 25%. The meeting set a guideline to produce a minimum of three letters per

year. The annual meeting approved splitting the Secretary Treasurer into two executive positions.

Curling included 32 regular and 8 Hutcheon rinks along with six teams for a Saturday funspiel. The hockey tournament included 11 teams. Tickets to the Mixer at Saskatoon Inn were \$7.

The off campus activities had now become known as Crop Production Week and the SAGA President was the representative on the planning committee. A Wednesday evening forum planned by the University was it's link to Crop Production Week.

Concern over Ag. Discovery Day was expressed at the February 11 executive meeting. Pre-registration was disappointing and apathy from both students and faculty was a factor. In March it was reported there were additional groups interested in joining Crop Production Week. The Classes of 1945 and 1948 organized their own summer reunions and there was discussion on whether or not SAGA should help organize such activities.

On November 1, Bill Cooper, representative on Advisory Council College of Agriculture, presented SAGA's report on the Diploma in Agriculture. It provided strong support for the program to remain part of the College of Agriculture. It also suggested the move to a three year program needed to be reconsidered since it appears to have had a negative effect.

1994

The 59th annual meeting was called to order at 1:15 pm on January 14 in 1E85 Agriculture building with thirty members present. It was preceded by Ag. Discovery Days held in the Tractor Lab, Engineering Building. Student attendance at Ag. Discovery Day was disappointing and the next executive was directed to make an early decision on the fate of the event. Curling with 10 Hutcheon and 32 open event rinks as well as hockey tournament with 12 hockey teams followed the annual meeting. There were also two women's hockey teams.

Having both the Mixer and banquet and dance at Saskatoon Inn had a positive effect on the reunion activities with all classes but '84 School having a function there. The Mixer was set for 600 with ag. students free and members and guests \$7. The Agro Band provided music during the event. Tickets for the banquet and dance was \$28 with dance only at \$10.

Concern was expressed that the College of Agriculture Advisory Council was becoming a reporting mechanism for the College rather than to receive advice from it's membership. The SAGA report on the diploma program was well received and on hold till after the College curriculum review. Concern was expressed about a weakening link between the College and community with the lack of facilities on campus for Farm and Home Week and it's move to Saskatoon Inn and change to Crop Production Week. There was a motion passed by the annual meeting to ask the Dean to hold a third Council meeting to accommodate members in presenting advice to the College.

The financial statement at October 31, 1993 showed cash and investments of \$68,140 compared to \$62,163 in 1992 and \$57,543 in 1991. The cumulative affects of budgeting reunion activities at a small surplus plus News editor Jack Braidek's efforts in getting a 32¢ mailing rate was having a positive affect. Cost of *THE SAGA* was below \$5,000 for the year.

Kim Harder (nee Oram) was elected vice-president to become the first female SAGA president at the 60th annual meeting in January 1995.

During the year a membership committee was struck and spent considerable time to develop a strategy to increase membership especially new grads. SVAA and ASA were invited to have representatives on SAGA executive and newsletters were placed in the lounges. Parents of new grads were urged to give a SAGA life membership at graduation.

1995

A full Ag. Discovery Day program was held on Friday January 13. It began with breakfast and milk boat races in the Atrium, Ag. Building. Three concurrent sessions took place during the morning followed by ASA and SVAA "Jeopardy" game competition over noon hour. The afternoon plenary session featured Harvey Brooks, Director Policy Branch CWB, Bill Cooper former Director WCWGA, Peter Volk Chairman SPI and Florian Possberg former Director SPI discussing the topic "Single Desk Selling or Dual Marketing the future of the Canadian Wheat Board & Saskatchewan Pork International Marketing". The day concluded with a "Wind Up Speech and Insight Into Agriculture Today" by Red Williams.

The 60th annual meeting was called to order at 1:40 pm in Room 133 Physics. SAGA membership had to choose between the annual meeting and plenary session. Thirty-one chose the annual meeting. During the usual reports from the SAGA committees there

was a special thank you to Bill Cooper for his College Advisory Council work. The university had approved the review of the Diploma Program much along the lines suggested by SAGA.

The hockey tournament included eight competitive teams and four recreational teams. Curling had twenty-four rinks in the open event and twelve in the Hutcheon event with finals on Sunday at the Granite Curling Club.

The Mixer on Friday evening and banquet and dance on Saturday evening were both held at the Saskatoon Inn. Ag students were admitted to the Mixer free of charge by showing their student card. The Agro Band again entertained at the Mixer that was attended by 624 Agros. To accommodate combining the student semi-formal with the SAGA banquet and dance the student price was set at \$20 (full price \$28) with dance only at \$5. Tables were set for 400 with tables available for 600 at the dance.

It was noted at the annual meeting that Mrs. Archie Campbell organized contacting the Class of '35 for their 60-year reunion.

At the April executive meeting, the idea of a single fundraising program for Ag. Alumni was presented by news letter Editor Jack Braidek. The idea arose out of the '51C class meeting to look at a 45 year reunion function. At that meeting a motion was passed to look into updating the SAGA history book as a 60th anniversary project

Both SVAA and ASA named representatives who attended and took an active part in SAGA executive meetings.

During the year Dr. John Stewart, Dean of Agriculture approached the executive about SAGA office moving to a different location to accommodate the cooperative education program being introduced into the College. With the change in location the College would look into a display case for the trophies and a place to hang the past presidents pictures and honorary life member scroll.

Ted Boychuk was given the go-ahead to accept curling prizes from Royal Bank, Cargill, Monsanto and John Deere, for the next three years. In earlier years seed and pork sides were prizes.

1996

The 61st annual meeting moved to the morning to avoid time conflict with Ag. Discovery Day which was expanded to include Agriview and Ag. Challenge. The meeting was called to order in the ASA Lounge, 1E04 Ag. Building at 10 am by Chairman Kim Harder with thirty-one members present. October 31, 1995 fiscal year end showed an investment total of \$70,893 and bank account of \$4,448.

Two major topics were covered by resolutions passed at the annual meeting.

COLLEGE TRUST FUND

Be it resolved that SAGA proceed to establish a Saskatchewan Agricultural Graduates Association Trust Fund for the purpose of supporting the activities of the College and School of Agriculture. The February Executive meeting set a committee of Bob Brack, Bob Tyler and Bob Rugg and Jack Braidek to work with the Dean to get this going.

SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE

- a) Be it resolved that the School of Agriculture move immediately to restructure to a two year program which will meet today's needs for the Saskatchewan Agricultural Industry.
- b) Be it resolved that if the university decides to review the School of Agriculture program by committee, that SAGA have at least one member on the committee.

The meeting passed a motion to proceed with updating and printing a new history book and that it include retyping the old book to correct typographical errors.

Curling with 30 open and 8 Hutcheon event rinks and hockey with 8 competitive, 4 recreational and 2 girls teams followed the annual meeting. The Friday evening Mixer at Saskatoon Inn was attended by 486 grads and 167 students. New to the Mixer was a fun money casino and auction run by ASA. The Saturday evening banquet and dance was set for 350 and held at Saskatoon Inn.

Bill Cooper, SAGA representative on the College of Agriculture Advisory Council reported in February that the Diploma Program Review would go ahead, a committee was formed and Jim Bessel agreed to be the SAGA representative. During the year discussion about some professional recognition for diploma graduates took place. A committee of Vice President Delahey, T. Herzog and J. Bissel was struck and a meeting held with Saskatchewan Institute of Agrologists.

At the October executive meeting President Rugg reported that Ag. Discovery day may not be held in 1997 due to a number of factors, one of which was poor attendance by students and faculty. A committee of SAGA President, Vice President and Secretary was formed to plan the meeting and to discuss the Diploma Review and professional recognition of diploma grads.

1997

The last thread of Farm and Home Week to the university was broken when the 62nd annual meeting moved off campus to Saskatoon Inn. The meeting was called to order at 9:40am with 32 members present. Honorary President George Wilson presented an updated constitution that was passed by the meeting. Following committee reports the meeting recessed for the panel discussion.

The panel topic "Professional Status for Diploma Grads" was chaired by Vice Chairman Delahey and included ten minute presentations by Judy Dyck, President SIA, Mason Maerz an employer and Jim Bessel SAGA representative on the Diploma Program Review. A large contingent of students attended the panel discussion and question period that followed.

The resolution passed at the 1996 annual meeting was reintroduced and again passed by the annual meeting; "Therefore be it resolved that the School of Agriculture move immediately to restructure to a two year program which will meet today's needs for the Saskatchewan Agricultural Industry". There was considerable discussion about Olds College two year program promotion and growth and the declining enrolment of the U of S three year program

Curling, hockey, mixer and banquet and dance followed the Annual meeting. One move from tradition was taped music rather than live band for the dance. Reunion year attendance was down and attributed to the harsh winter weather.

It was reported at the September 1997 executive meeting that the Diploma Review Committee report had gone to the university and one of the recommendations was to change to a two-year program. The discussions with SIA on an affiliate membership for diploma grads was also progressing favorably.

In November, SAGA executive members met with representative of the Alumni Association for a tour of the old stone barn and its "Raisers Club" to the annual meeting. The purpose of the club would be to provide funding to do a feasibility study on potential renovation and use of the barn.

1998

The 63rd annual meeting was called to order at 9:45 am at Saskatoon Inn. The 49 members present introduced themselves and held a moment of silence for 34 grads who had passed away.

Bob McKercher Co-Chair of the Diploma Review Committee presented the meeting with an update of the process. The committee recommendations have been printed and presented to the University Vice-President. The Dean and Administration make the final decision. External reviewers, Dr. Don Flaten U of M and Prof. Mike Jenkins, Guelph are here this week and will report back to the Review Committee. Two of the recommendations in the report are that "U of S continue to offer a Diploma in Agriculture Program, with the resources to run it" and the program be changed to two years.

Glen Hass, SIA Registrar, reported Council had drafted a by-law change to be voted on at the April 1998 annual meeting. The by-law allows for affiliate membership as Agricultural Technologist. Successful completion of a recognized Canadian Agricultural Diploma in Agriculture Program is the standard proposed.

The meeting recessed for a presentation on potential use for the old stone dairy barn by Larry Harder university architect and Elaine Cadell, Director of Alumni Affairs. This was followed with a motion by R. Delahey and J. Zeman that SAGA sponsor a "Barn Builder Club" to raise money to do a feasibility study, membership to be \$500. The executive at it's February meeting formed a committee of Braidek, Tyler, Delahey and Brack to get the ball rolling to raise \$30,000.

Friday afternoon saw the beginning of the hockey tournament, with 12 teams and curling with 31 teams begin the sporting activities. The Mixer went at Saskatoon Inn on Friday evening and banquet and dance Saturday evening at Saskatoon Inn. There had been no complaints about taped music at last years event and tapes were again used.

The passing of John Rogers was noted at the April executive meeting. He would have been 100 in

November 1998 and was the oldest member of SAGA. The Registrar of Companies in Regina indicated SAGA had listed more directors than allowed for in the charter and would remove the organization from the register if not corrected by May 15. Treasurer Turley agreed to contact Regina to sort out the problem.

All of the reunion week activities made money in 1998. Net return for Mixer was \$2187.97, banquet and dance \$2675.00, curling \$302.07 and hockey \$50.92. Membership numbers received considerable attention during the year and the executive allocated \$1,000.00 for contacting the upcoming non-members of reunion years and the 1998 graduation classes. \$250 was also allocated to ASA for repairs to the piano.

1999

The 64th annual meeting was called to order at 9:40am at Saskatoon with 53 members in attendance. The Barn Builders fund stood at \$11,900 from two mailings. The Committee is considering also an application to the Agriculture Endowment Trust Fund. It is estimated the architect will charge \$20-30,000 for a feasibility study. Bank balance at the October 31, 1998 fiscal year end stood at \$82,972.52 compared to \$82529.97 in 1997, \$80,850.34 in 1996 and \$75,530.74 in 1985.

Life memberships had increased in the past two years but annual memberships have declined. Attendance of the five-year class has dwindled to zero and no attendance as a group at the banquet and dance by ten-year grads. Editor Braidek reported *THE SAGA* was now on E-mail at <thesaga@home.com> which would make it easier to send in information.

The History Book Committee reported the book was purposely delayed to become a millennium project and be ready for the year 2000 reunion. There could be some grants to help cover the cost of it. A committee of Jack Braidek, Bob McKercher, Les Henry and Lorence Peterson have started the project.

Hockey with eleven teams and curling with 33 teams followed the annual meeting. The Mixer was held at

Saskatoon Inn Friday evening and banquet and dance on Saturday evening. A certificate was presented to Dr. John Stewart, retiring Dean of Agriculture.

At the February executive meeting it was reported there would now be a composers, authors and poets tax on the SAGA banquet and dance and the new committee was asked to get quotes from other facilities and compare prices. A number of ideas along the millennium theme were looked at as a method of creating enthusiasm and increasing participation and membership. The School of Agriculture was now officially a thing of the past and now called Diploma in Agriculture. This requires a change in the SAGA Constitution.

In April a Millennium committee of Lammerding, Loessin, Bobinski and Fulton reported on plans for 2000 including auction of a leather bound history book, ag. industry panel and a look at other activities to increase interest in SAGA. The sum of \$1,000 was allocated to update and reframe SAGA Past President pictures for display. The news editor reported postage for the newsletter had risen from 32.5¢ to 41.5¢ which will increase the cost per member to over \$5.

Happenings

Agros and VocAgos are always a lively lot in their campus years: pranks and amusing incidents abound.

One such incident became known as the great piano caper. At one time the School of Agriculture had a piano in the fireplace room of Kirk Hall. At some date in the late fifties or early sixties, some students borrowed the piano for a function somewhere on the exhibition grounds. Names are hard to come by, but Bob Brack knows about the event and he might even say that Glen Farrell was involved. One of the students came up with a pickup truck and the piano was loaded on to the truck with much grunting and cursing. As it turned out, it was much easier to unload. A jackrabbit start at a traffic light was all that was required to deposit the piano on the street with a tremendous thud. Details are vague about the fate of the piano after it landed on the street.

The Class of '52 had a prankster from another year who was in some of their classes. In a hort lab class they threw the prankster in the fish pool under the greenhouse tables. Margaret Young appeared just as he was crawling out dripping wet. She immediately called Dr. Paterson who called Dean Vic Graham. His first response was "How did you get him in there" as he was a really big guy. The Dean was sympathetic and no one was dismissed.

Tom Townley-Smith '32C recalls agros using Dean Shaw's prize Clydesdale horses for jousting in the hockey arena in the fall before the ice went in. They dressed all up in medieval garb and had a big time much to the horror of the Dean.

In the winter of 1951-52 overcoats were the winter dress and trolley buses served the University, having recently replaced the streetcars. There was a trolley terminal at College and Bottomley. One evening a small group of second year agros, lead by Don Love, took possession of a trolley at the Bottomley terminal as the trolley driver was punching out his time card. They simply got on, kept the driver off and headed down College Drive. A classmate on his way home across the 25th Street bridge happened by and was offered a ride home, even though the trolley route wasn't across the bridge. He declined. Once at the bridge the stolen bus was driven across the bridge (it was all downhill) and parked on Spadina. The agros left, the bus was recovered but despite enquires the agros were never found out.

The same Don Love was also fond of visiting Sask. Hall dorms which were off limits for males. One night, he was warned of an impending raid and exited the nearest window, thinking he was on the first floor. It was in fact the second floor and his back injury required a brace for the remainder of the term.

Many professors in the College of Agriculture have become famous for their lecture styles, but none more so than Professor Hadley van Vliet, Professor of Ag. Econ. He could add up a column of figures on a blackboard faster than any of today's calculators. When he entered the lecture room, he usually set a file of notes on the desk at the front of the room, but he never looked at the notes. If he left off at point 7 on

a given day, he was sure to carry on at point 8 next day – all without reference to any notes. He chain smoked, in class and out. He would light his cigarette by striking a wooden Eddy match with a quick swipe on his trouser leg.

A friendly man, he was known affectionately as Van to all and sundry. People would come to Farm and Home week just to listen to Van at the lecture podium – he was a master of oratory and a very entertaining speaker. When he presented an Honorary Life Membership at the SAGA banquet and dance, it was the highlight and talked about for days after. In 1966 Van was presented with an Honorary Life Membership himself. In those days it was kept a secret until the actual presentation. Well, for the first time in his life, Van was speechless - for a couple of seconds, then he went on to give an impromptu thank you speech as if he had been preparing it for a month.

His prowess carried through to activities outside the classroom. Van wore only a sports coat (never a tie),

inside or out, no matter if it was 40 below. He was reputed to travel light, carrying only his tooth brush and a bar of soap. He jumped in his car and had it in reverse before the 3rd cylinder had fired. Van was sure to be found at the poker table at the smoker and was well known on the curling ice. When it came time to clean his rock before a shot, he picked up the rock with one hand and wiped it on his chest.

Van was not a mere prof – he was a phenomenon and anyone lucky enough to cross paths with him will never forget the experience or the great van Vliet. His name now honors the Ag. Econ. library and a chair in the department.

And how to react when the boys give a whistle.

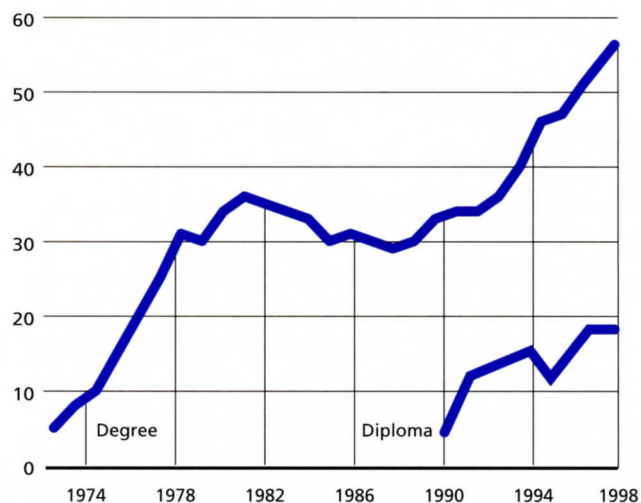
Besides all this work, we do have some play

And to me as an Agro it means everything.



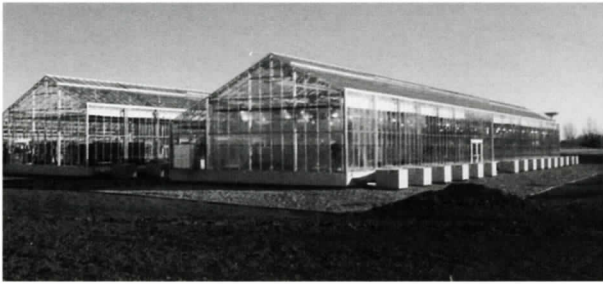
1947 graduates (l to r), Muriel Welling, Anne Saville and Forest Howell at the 1997 reunion.

FEMALE GRADUATES FROM THE COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE (percentage)



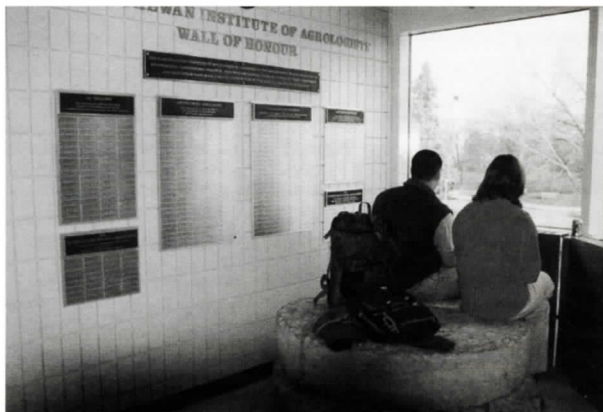

The greenhouses were built in 1994 to serve expanded crop research programs and they will be added to in 2000. They are highly automated – a far cry from older greenhouses. They are located north of perimeter road, adjacent to the research park.



The Hangar Building, one of the buildings that survived World War II and some 47 years as a lecture hall and home for the Drama Department, was torn down in the summer of 1994. Land on which it stood is now a parking lot.



The millstones, that spent many years in the Livestock Pavilion, now rest on the second floor of the Agriculture Building, along the hall from the lunch room at the Wall of Honour. They are a good conversation piece and a place to park for lunch or rest.

Agriculture Buildings

The first university building started was the College of Agriculture Building. Sir Wilfred Laurier laid the corner stone in 1910. It soon became known as the College Building, and later the Administration Building. It is now empty and its future is in limbo. The Dean of Agriculture's residence (now the Faculty Club) was ready for use in 1911 and was the first stone building to be in use on the campus.

The university building program has always been sporadic. This is understandable since all university building until recently was dependent entirely on provincial funding.

The present Agriculture Building, completed in 1991, was the first university building to be partially funded by non-government contributions. President Leo Kristjanson announced the Sodbusters Campaign at Farm and Home Week, January 13, 1981 and invited donations for a feasibility study for this building. The Agriculture Building had about 14% of its cost funded from sources outside the provincial budget. Construction of a sixth floor extension began in March, 1999 at an estimated end cost of \$10M. This project will be financed entirely by donations to the College of Agriculture with no provincial capital funding involved. When completed in the year 2000, approximately 22% of the cost for the Agriculture Building will have been by private fundraising.

How the university will eventually fund future capital (building) programs remains uncertain, but it seems clear that new buildings will come only if users can attract at least some of the construction cost. This has already been the case for Chemistry, Chemical Engineering, the farmstead non-academic buildings, and an addition to Commerce.

The major agricultural buildings and their years of construction are summarized below. It is difficult to establish the year of occupancy for earlier buildings. Most dates before the 1950's represent the year construction began. Since the 1950's the years generally represent when the building was put into use.

It should be noted that all agriculture buildings constructed in the first 40 years are now being used by other colleges except for the Livestock Pavilion which

was demolished. The College Building and the barn stand unused and face an uncertain future.

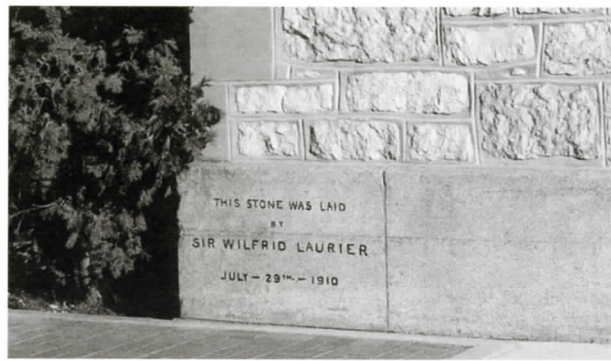

The above listing includes major construction in Engineering because the Department of Agricultural Mechanics, now Agricultural and Bioresource Engineering, has always been an integral part of instruction for diploma and degree students in Agriculture. In 1950, the Department of Animal Science, the last agriculture department to leave the College Building, moved into a wooden frame building located between the present Veterinary Medicine and Agriculture Buildings. The original purpose of this frame building was a place to study swamp fever in horses.

Numerous other smaller buildings are part of the college's physical plant. Most of these are under departmental control.

Stone for the College Building

Herb Wilson's³⁶⁵, in his book, *My Memoirs*, describes the involvement of his family in the construction of the College Building on the University of Saskatchewan campus as follows:

My parents worked on a farm in Manitoba until the fall of 1909 [Herb Wilson's parents had immigrated from England earlier that year]. Then they went to Saskatoon. Dad bought a team of horses there, and their first job was as a snatch team to hook onto the front of teams that got stuck on 2nd Avenue, to pull them out. He then got a job with Smith Brothers and Wilson, blasting rocks and hauling them from the quarry to the stone masons to be cut for use in university buildings.

Dad built a shack at the quarry and Mom cooked for the men that worked there. Dad also built a shack on two small lots on the University Heights, so he could enter a contract to store stones as the stone masons cut them. He hired his brother Robert to drive his second team and they stored all of the stones that had been measured and properly cut.

Dad and uncle Robert had not joined the union, so the union insisted they be fired. And they were fired. However Dad was the only one that had the records of where various stones, previously carefully measured and properly cut, were stored, so they rehired Dad and uncle Robert to haul those stones as they were needed. They rehired them at one and a half times their former wages: The extra pay was for them to put up with the harassment of union members.

On July 29, 1910, Dad hauled the cornerstone up to the site of the Agriculture Building, and his brother Robert operated the crane that lifted the cornerstone so Sir Wilfred Laurier, our prime minister, could properly make his dedication. When I attended university later, I walked past this marked stone nearly every day.

University Farm Land

The original structure of the University of Saskatchewan was unique among universities in that a College of Agriculture was an integral part of it. In order to support its work a parcel of 1040 acres of good quality land was purchased and turned over to the college. In the first few years it was used mainly for pasture and fodder for the farm stock, though 70 acres was set aside for field crop trials and a larger area was used to grow wheat in what is believed an attempt to generate income.

Additional land close to the campus was obtained at various times in the first forty years of the college, but at the same time the original farm suffered the loss of much of its area through the separation of small and large parcels deemed necessary for other

uses. And there was pressing need for more land to support expanded field crop and livestock research programs. The college was growing and needed more land and other facilities.

By the early 1960s the college had to replace its shrunken land holdings located close to the campus with land at more remote locations. Substantial land acquisitions were made in the 1970s including the seven quarter Goodale farm near Floral, two sections of Kernan land, of which over 900 acres is cropped and the three section Termuende Farm at Lanigan. Stones were removed from some lands to increase arable acres.

The university has also leased land, sometimes large tracts of land, for specific programs. Among these was a 4449 to 5760 acre lease (1925 to 1963) from the R.M of Dundurn and the Department of National Defence for a large sheep breeding experiment, and 2500 acres for cattle cross-breeding programs on the Matador Ranch in 1929 to 1934. A second Matador lease of 1920 acres in 1967 is used for studies on native grassland.

The current university land holding for research and teaching, owned and leased, is about 8060 acres.

TOMMY FRASER AWARD WINNERS (DEGREE) 1940 to 1999
